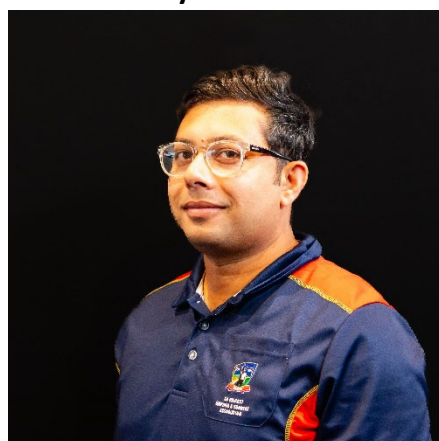

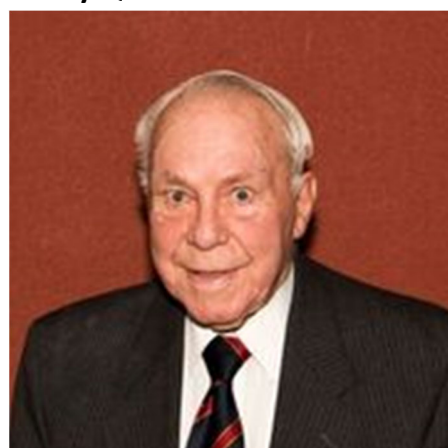

MINUTES OF ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING
10th August 2022

1. Open Meeting

2. Welcome

3. Apologies

Apologies received by Secretary – Ian Lowe, Adrian Linacre, Eloise Sheridan, Richard Williams, Sumit Sindhu, James Assheton, Thilak Ambepitiya, Doug Jewell, Mike Blackwell, Seb Todd and Anthony Rogers.

4. Minutes Silence

Darran Swain asked everyone to stand for a minute's silence for our late member Peter Raftery who passed during the past year.

5. Minutes of 2021 AGM

The Minutes of the 2021 Annual Meeting as presented in the Annual Report were adopted on the motion of Shane Roberts and Dhaval Bhatt.

6. Business arising from 2021 AGM

There was no business arising from the 2021 AGM.

7. President's Report

Darran Swain spoke about his report and thanked everyone for their support of the association.

8. Correspondence

There was no correspondence relevant to the meeting.

9. Secretary's Report

15. Constitution Change

Darran Swain opened the floor to discuss the proposed changes to the constitution and Neil Ricketts raised the possibility of changing the Life Membership to allow more than one to be bestowed each year without

requiring the five signatures of support and for the Executive to decide on those eligible and not the membership. It was decided that we will vote on the existing changes and circulate the proposed additional changes at a future special meeting. The changes to the constitution as distributed were moved by Ed Branson and seconded by Peter Waldie. Passed by a show of hands.

16. Declaration of Vacant Positions

The following positions are declared vacant as of 1st September 2022 – President, Vice President, Treasurer, 3 Committee Members for a 2-year term and there are 2 extraordinary vacancies for Committee Members for a 1-year term.

17. Election of Office Bearers

President – one nomination – Darran Swain elected unopposed. Vice President – one nomination – Bruce Stribley elected unopposed. Treasurer – one nomination – Lynton Donisthorpe elected unopposed.

18. Election of Committee Members (2-Year Term)

Committee – seven nominations received – Fahmid Ahmed, Adrian Drosd, John Nemcic, Lesley Quaini, Shane Roberts, Tim Tonkin and Peter Waldie. After a secret ballot Fahmid Ahmed, John Nemcic and Lesley Quaini were elected.

19. Extraordinary Election of Committee Members (1-Year Term)

A call of nominations was asked for from the floor for the 2 extraordinary vacant committee positions and four nominations were received – Adrian Drosd, Shane Roberts, Tim Tonkin and Peter Waldie. After a secret ballot – Shane Roberts and Tim Tonkin were elected.

20. Life Member Nomination

We have one nomination for Life Member – Bruce Stribley from Lynton Donisthorpe. Lynton spoke on behalf of his nomination and after a secret ballot Life Membership was bestowed upon Bruce Stribley.

21. Subscriptions

The Committee has decided that our membership fees should increase to \$110.00 this season. Lynton Donisthorpe moved that the fee structure as presented be adopted, seconded by Tim Tonkin and carried by a show of hands.

22. Honoraria

Lynton Donisthorpe advised that the Committee proposed that the honorariums for next season remain at their current amounts. This was moved by Lynton Donisthorpe, seconded by David Little and carried by a show of hands.

23. Auditors

PRESIDENT'S REPORT (Darran Swain)



SACUSA Members,

It is with great pleasure that I present my President's Report of our Association for the 2022/2023 year. A year in which the South Australian Cricket Umpires & Scorers Association continued to support the growth of cricket in SA and across the nation.

We started the season with Sarah Fry taking maternity leave and Cate Ryan filling her shoes. A huge thank you to Sarah, Cate, and Craig for all the hard work throughout the season, it goes without saying, it is very much appreciated.

At last year's AGM, we welcomed John Nemicic and Tim Tonkin on to the executive committee, however, Tim Tonkin (due to personal reasons) stood down from the executive in December. We then welcome Adrian Drosd to the executive committee to fill in for Tim's position until the AGM in August 2023. We inducted Life Member no# 83 Bruce Stribley into Life Membership and I think we all agree that Bruce is a very worthy Life Member.

In August, the 2022/2023 umpiring season launch was held at the Adelaide Entertainment Centre where we were advised of dates of when the season will start and any changes for the upcoming season. What a fantastic morning this was. Our state-wide annual Umpire Seminar was held in September at KRO. This annual pre-season training and preparation opportunity was generously coordinated by our Cricket Operations & Match Officials Managers Sarah Fry & Cate Ryan and SACA Umpire Administrator and Development Officer Craig Thomas. Throughout the sessions we had Panel 1 umpires from SACA & ATCA present various topics, i.e., wides / no balls, LBW decisions, reporting etc. as well as giving us information and how to use Play HQ. What a fantastic seminar with great information and advice.

Scorers also held their own seminar/training day run by SACA with assistance from Leslie Quaini, Neil Ricketts and Mick Harper. This seminar included training in scoring at various levels, from beginners to 1st Grade. Five clubs (18 members) have taken up the offer of having their scorers join and each scorer then gets provided with a name badge, Scorer Handbook, and pencil case with the SACUSA logo. Over the past few years, the SACUSA Scorer's subcommittee, led by Lesley Quaini has done a wonderful job in promoting scoring throughout SACUSA and SACA. They have developed a Scorer's Level 1 accreditation which is online for anyone wishing to complete the course and become a scorer. The Level 2 accreditation course will be online shortly so please look out for that one. These courses can be found on our SACUSA website.

Grand Finals are the goal for all teams each year, but they are also important for umpires. Well done to all umpires and scorers for a great season, and congratulations to all the umpires and scorers that officiated in the final series throughout the season. Regardless of the situation, everyone can be successful if you put in time, effort, and hard work. Well done to all umpires and scorers on a fantastic season.

The Bradman Rolton Medal night return to a sit-down formal dinner and was attended by 20 members. It was a wonderful night, where all players from all clubs and umpires could mingle and catch up with each other. Congratulations to all the winners, in particular Harry Singh for winning SACA Umpire of the Year.

Easter saw us, finally host the Crockett Shield match against the Victorians, after heavy rains on the Thursday, Friday and early Saturday morning and an early morning trip to the ground by Craig Thomas and myself, and assistance by Ash Barrow from Victoria we manage to get a pitch up. The game was delayed by 3 hours and both presidents and captains agreed to have a T20 game due to time. It was a great game that was won by us. Well done to our Crockett Shield team on a great win and bringing back the Crockett Shield after 10 years from our last victory. On the Sunday we played Quoits for the K C Butler trophy and after some very close games SA came out on top and winning the KC Butler trophy. Our Presentation Dinner was a great success attended by 80 members and partners. Ben Hook & Darry Harper were unavailable this year, so we had David Kempe as our MC who did a fantastic job and kept the night rolling along. We, as umpires and scorers, nothing will change except for witnessing the great talent and being involved in fantastic cricket, that we have here in South Australia. The season officially starts on October 7th & 8th with T20 games for 1st Grade Men's and Women's with the remaining seniors and juniors' grades starting the following weekend.

We are very fortunate to receive support at our monthly meetings from those who supply raffle prizes as well gain prizes for our Presentation Dinner from individuals to businesses. 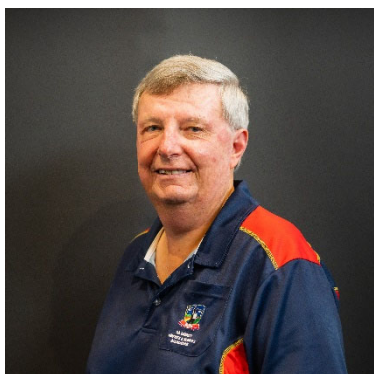

TREASURER'S REPORT

(Lynton Donisthorpe OAM)



Mr President and SACUSA Members,

It is with great pleasure that I present to you the Treasurer's Report of our Association's business for the 2022-2023 financial year.

Balance Sheet Summary

This year we have delivered a moderate loss, due largely to us hosting the Easter/Crockett Shield, (see Budget Comparison section for details). Receipts for the year of \$83,423.58 and payments of \$85,675.47, provided a Working Account end of financial year loss of \$2,251.89 and a balance of \$26,303.41.

Membership

Membership numbers were a little lower in 2022/23 with 119 Full Members (128 in 2021/22) and 3 Associate Members (5 in 2021/22), Life Members are not included in these figures. The club scorer initiative, now in its 7th season, was lower, with 5 clubs taking part this year (7 in 2021/22) and this year we had 18 scorer Full Members via this initiative.

Sponsorship

Sponsorship income was the same as 2021/22 with SACA continuing as a major sponsor and Coverdrive Couriers continuing the fantastic financial support they have provided to SACUSA for a very long time. On behalf of members, I thank them both for their significant contribution yet again.

Budget Comparisons

Our Loss of \$2,251.89 was significantly below our budgeted/predicted Loss of \$6,085. This was mainly due to event costs coming in under budget. Easter came in under budget (\$3,158.27 below budget), thanks in part, to a \$1,250 contribution to the event by SACA, also a less than expected Bradman Medal event costs (\$750 below budget). Property for Re-sale costs were higher than expected (\$1,377.80 above budget) due to the continued widespread use of SACUSA apparel (in addition to stock). Remaining items were largely around budget estimates when allowing for normal fluctuations and the training amount not spent. We should note the EC's conservative budgeting policy as a prudent method for managing members funds.

Trust Accounts

The Gladstone Jones and George McDonagh trust funds (held in Westpac Community Solutions Cash Reserve Account), bequeathed to SACUSA for Crockett Shield Trophies, was boosted this financial year with a donation by Don Bills, on behalf of members I'd like to thank Don most sincerely for his generous donation. Crockett Shield trophy costs of \$142.30 were withdrawn from the account for Easter Trophies. The donation and interest resulted in a total income for the year of \$200.05. This left a final account balance of \$1,260.38 split between the two funds as follows: Jones \$601.94 and McDonagh \$658.44.

Credit Card Account

The EC decided that it was not appropriate for members to pay for significant cost items for SACUSA from their personal funds (and be re-imbursed). Therefore, the EC approved the setting up a SACUSA Credit Card Account in September 2022. This account has a \$0 overdraft limit and operates with a \$0 balance. Only when SACUSA expenditure using the CC is required, the exact amounts will be transferred from the working account (via the normal process, approved by 2 signatures, as per the Constitution), the person approved to use the card for this expenditure will use it for the specific purpose and amount. From this year, the Balance Sheet will show the CC account summary along with other accounts.

Overview of Current Financial Position & Outlook

SACUSA had a better-than-expected financial year and used less of our surplus funds than anticipated. Looking forward, even without significant expenditure events (e.g., Easter, etc.), our finances will be

stretched. Increased costs are making it more difficult to provide events, activities and items for our members at our current level and maintain our balance stable without using a significant amount of our surplus funds. While as a Not-for-Profit organisation we should not be hoarding funds or providing profits, we do need to maintain a reasonable buffer, which we can only do by keeping income at the level of expenditure. Overall, this will require us to find ways of increasing our total income moving forward.

The COVID19 challenges of recent years seem to be behind us and had little impact on our finances this year. A strong financial position we have built over the past decade is a position we should maintain to ensure that SACUSA can thrive well into the future.

Glad Jones and George McDonagh Memorial Trust Funds

As a part of the biennial cricket match against the Victorian Cricket Association Umpires and Scorers Association, trophies are awarded to the best performed South Australian players for overall performance and fielding. These awards are made possible by trust funds held by the South Australian Cricket Umpires and Scorers Association from monies donated by former members, Gladstone Jones and George McDonagh.

The first fund, the Glad Jones Memorial Trust Fund, was established in March 1976 with a donation of \$150.00 from Mr. Gladstone Jones for a trophy to be awarded to the best performed player representing South Australia. Two years later Mr. George McDonagh made a similar donation, establishing the George McDonagh Memorial Trust Fund to enable an award to be made to the best performed fielder during these matches.

The donations remain invested at the discretion of the SACUSA Committee, however, if a decision was taken to discontinue the matches in the future, the funds and any interest earned was to be donated to the National Heart Foundation. After the establishment of both funds the Executive Committee of the South Australian Cricket Umpires Association was empowered to use the interest earned from both funds to award the trophies after each match. An increase to the capital invested of \$200.00 was made to each fund during the late 1980's from interest already earned to ensure that a sound basis for interest earning existed and therefore the continuation of the awards.


The Committee is responsible for overseeing SACUSA's financial reporting process.

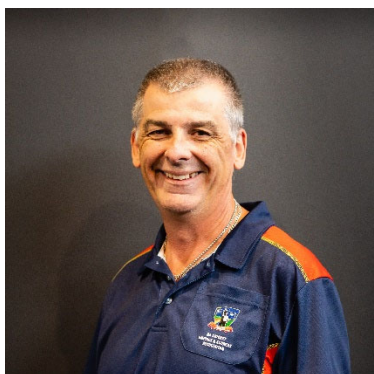

SCORERS SUBCOMMITTEE REPORT (Lesley Quaini)



Mr. President and Members,

Season 22/23 was both interesting and challenging for scorers with the introduction of PlayHQ Electronic Scoring programme. This program was trialled in our off season, up in Darwin. Cricket Australia received feedback but did not act on that feedback until 2 rounds of our competition had begun, causing a few 'headaches' for scorers. As the season progressed, scorers became more confident with the program but there are still processes that need to be fixed, to become more 'user' friendly.

On a more positive note, Adelaide was lucky enough to host the CA Under 19 Male National Championships in December of 2022. 20 scorers made their time available for 32 matches, requiring 11 scorers per day. Karen Rolton Oval, Park 25 No. 1, 2 and 3 were the main ovals used but an extra 7 suburban ovals were needed, over the course of the week, to complete the heavy schedule of games. It was great to see a mixture of experienced as well as some new members experiencing their first taste of a CA National Championship. Scorer involvement is an integral part in making the tournament a success.

Special mention to Thomas Woodcock and Sue Bishop for officiating at this level for the first time, to Brian Kerr, Mick Harper and Mark Harris for scoring the Grand Final between NSW(M) and QLD(M). Also, a special mention to Kate Murphy, from Northern Districts Cricket Club, for scoring in her first BBL game at Adelaide Oval on New Years Eve and to David Kempe, Adelaide Cricket Club, for achieving the 500 games scored milestone.

The Scorers Training Session at the beginning of the season was well attended. After a general introduction, scorers were split into two groups: experienced and 'beginners'. This was very beneficial because both groups could concentrate on matters that were relevant to them. The 'beginners' group were also introduced to Level 1 Community Scorers Accreditation on SACUSA's website. There has been positive feedback from scorers across Australia about our implementation of scorer accreditation. Level 2 Representative Scorers Accreditation is almost finished, with some 'fine tuning' still needing to be completed. We are hoping to introduce this level of accreditation to SACA's current pool of scorers at the annual pre-season Seminar, before opening it up to other scorers. Thanks must go to Mick Harper and Cate Ryan for their hard work and expertise in putting the required material together.

Thank you to Adelaide, Glenelg, Kensington, Port Adelaide and Prospect for joining the SACUSA Scorer Membership in 2022/23, on behalf of their scorers. A big 'Thank You' to Cate Ryan, Mick Harper, Neil Ricketts and Lynton Donisthorpe for their time and commitment to the Subcommittee throughout the year.

Congratulations to Gary Kuchta, from the Glenelg Cricket Club, for being a well-deserved recipient of the Buckett/Hammond Scorer of the Year Award 2022/23. Gary started scoring in 2008/9 and has now scored over 250 games across different forms of cricket. He is highly regarded by all cricket officials within the Premier Cricket competition because of his helpful, generous, loyal, and of course his humble nature.

SACA CRICKET OPERATIONS & MATCH OFFICIALS MANAGER REPORT

(Cate Ryan)



Mr President and Members of SACUSA,

Well done to all Match Officials on a great year. It was an exciting season of debuts, milestones and opportunities for South Australian Match Officials, and it was pleasing to see our group progress and further develop during this time.

In August we ushered in the season over breakfast at the Adelaide Entertainment Centre. Hosted by Wayne Phillips, we heard about Peter George and Richard Williams' journeys into cricket umpiring. Several umpire training nights and our annual seminar then followed across the season. We were treated to some fantastic guest speakers and presenters at these sessions including Cricket Australia National and Supplementary Umpire Panel members Greg Davidson, Phil Gillespie, Claire Polosak and Ben Treloar.

Our scorers had their own pre-season training session in September which was very well attended. Whilst the main focus was on the immediate implementation of PlayHQ Live Scoring, attendees were then split with agendas pertinent to that groups experience level for more targeted discussions.

We were fortunate to host several ICC Elite Umpire and Referee Panel members for a question-and-answer session before their ICC Men's T20 World Cup duties at Adelaide Oval. Chris Brown, Aleem Dar, Michael Gough, Adrian Holdstock, Ranjan Madugalle and Joel Wilson all shared their insights and learnings from officiating at the highest level.

Cricket Australia Supplementary Umpire Panel member Eloise Sheridan had another significant season, including appointments across three continents. She travelled to Birmingham in July 2022 for the Commonwealth Games which featured women's T20 for the first time. This experience culminated in appointment to the Bronze Medal match between England and New Zealand. In December 2022, Eloise stood in six New Zealand Super Smash T20 matches; and finished her international season in South Africa at the ICC Women's T20 World Cup. Appointed to eight minor round matches, Eloise was then appointed Third Umpire to the Semi Final between the hosts and England at Newlands Oval. On Australian soil, Eloise stood in the Commonwealth Bank Women's Series between Australia and Pakistan. This combined One-Day and T20 International Series held on the east coast also included appointment to the annual Governor Generals XI match. From a domestic cricket perspective, Eloise became the first female to stand on-field in a Men's T20 Domestic (KFC BBL) fixture in December. This complemented her List-A umpiring debut earlier in the season in the Marsh One-Day Cup clash between the West End Redbacks and Tasmania, with both games played at Adelaide Oval. Eloise was also instrumental throughout the women's domestic season, including appointment to the WNCL and Weber WBBL competitions. Her strong performances were rewarded with appointment to the Weber WBBL|08 Grand Final between the Sydney Sixers and Adelaide Strikers at North Sydney Oval.

Dhaval Bhatt, Eloise Sheridan and Harsimran Singh all returned to the South Australia State Umpire Panel, whilst the latter two members also completed the invite-only Cricket Australia High Performance Officiating (Level 3) Accreditation. South Australian umpiring stalwarts Steve Davis and Simon Fry were reappointed to Cricket Australia's Match Referee Panel, whilst Daryl Harper was reappointed as an Umpire Selector for Cricket Australia.

Three South Australian umpires attended Cricket Australia National Championships, including Dhaval Bhatt who officiated at the CA Under 19 Female Championships in Perth, and Peter George and Harsimran Singh who both stood in the CA Under 17 Male tournament in Hobart. A special congratulations to Peter who was appointed to the Grand Final fixture in his first national tournament appearance as an umpire.

Our Scoring fraternity had an equally busy season. Alongside traditionally scheduled international and domestic cricket fixtures, Adelaide also played host to seven ICC World T20 Cup fixtures. Scorers Mick Harper, Ian Graham and Neil Ricketts were appointed to all three double-header fixtures, as well as the standalone Semi Final between India and England. We also thank the 15 individual Scorers for their contributions during the CA Under 19 Male Championships, held across Adelaide leading into the Christmas break.

We recognised four significant scoring milestones this season. Sheryl Bevan and Kate Murphy made their respective List-A and Men's Domestic T20 scoring debuts, whilst long serving cricket volunteer David Kempe scored his 500th match and Neil Ricketts was acknowledged for his 50 years of service to cricket.

We welcomed back the annual Premier Cricket Umpire Exchange between South Australia and Victoria. Peter Waldie was announced as the Community Official of the Year at the annual SACA Community Cricket Awards in March 2023. At the same event Brian Bayless was presented with his 50 Years of Service to Cricket certificate, whilst Edward Branson, Peter Laidler and David Rodgers were presented with 25 Years of Service to Cricket awards.

Craig Thomas continued as SACA's Umpire Administration and Development Officer in a full-time capacity. His involvement and input across the season was invaluable and we thank him for all his efforts and continued support that he provides. Thank you also to our Umpire Coaches who work tirelessly to help and develop all our umpires on a weekly basis.

Off-field we continue to be reliant on several passionate volunteer Associations who complement SACA's efforts in growing the game and creating a positive experience for all participants. To the members of the South Australian Cricket Umpires and Scorers Association (SACUSA) and the SACA Scoring Committee – thank you. I'd like to personally acknowledge the support and direction provided by Darran Swain across the season in particular.

Congratulations to all Match Officials and well done on your achievements. Thank you for your commitment and dedication across the season and we look forward to what the future holds.

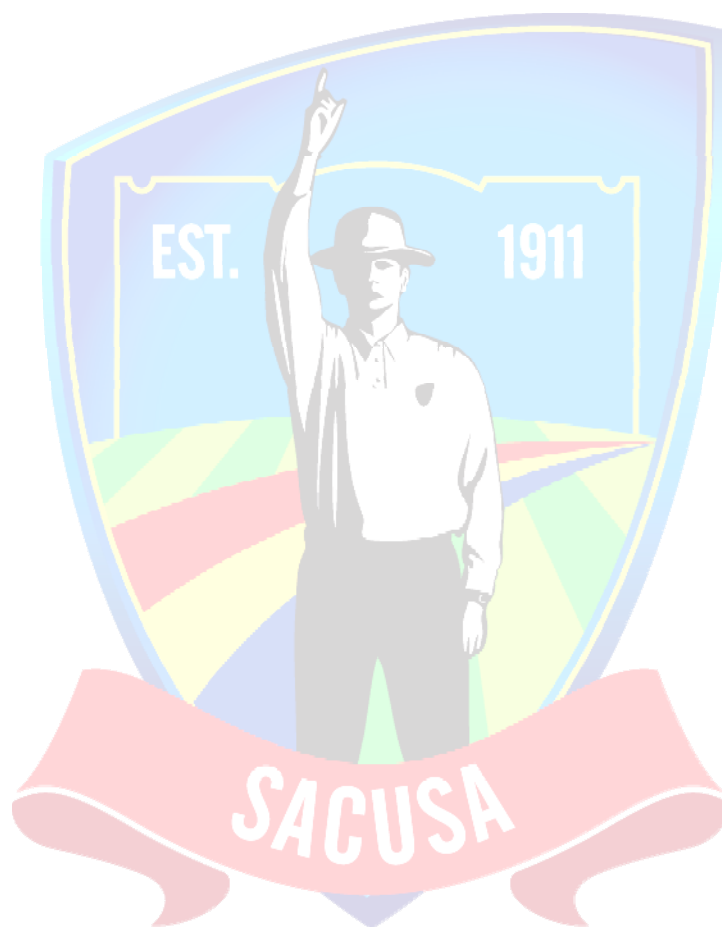

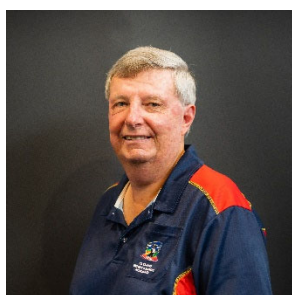

EASTER COMMITTEE REPORT (Lynton Donisthorpe)



Mr President and Members of SACUSA,

The Crockett Shield Easter event 2023 was a very long time coming! Eventually, after the event had to be postponed twice (in 2021 & 2022) due to COVID19, we were able to host our Victorian friends from the VCAUSA for the Crockett Shield Easter weekend this year.

Management of the event was assigned to the Easter Committee; Chris Hollard, Lesley Quaini, Ted Branson, Kurt Miegel, Paul Welbourne and myself. The Easter event involves a significant amount of work with accommodation research/bookings and commencing at least one year out from the event (having to do it 3 times did not help!). A huge vote of thanks to these people for their tireless efforts in pulling it all together and making it the success it was.

This year was one of innovation for the Easter event. There were several format changes trialled, which are aimed to assist members by reducing costs and providing more flexibility, including: a “finger food” informal/casual welcome event on Friday night (in lieu of the traditional seated event), drinks were not included in event costs, but purchased by members from the bar for all events instead. These changes proved successful and generally popular with members and will be adopted going forward.

This year we hosted our visitors at The Lakes Resort Hotel at West Lakes as it offered us excellent accommodation and event venues as well as good value for money for VCAUSA visiting members. We again used Henley High School for the Crockett Shield match and Club West Lakes, at West Lakes Shore for the KC Butler event. All of which proved to be well suited to our needs.

While the “big ticket” items above were significant, the smaller touches we provided, such as a Joint Law43/Sticky Wicket publication, new numbered caps, and new shirts for SACUSA players, along with supporter shirts all contributed to rounding out the weekend’s experiences for those participating.

It all commenced with our very own Daryl Harper as MC for the Welcome and Presentation Dinners. A big thank you to Daryl for the great job he did, adding a real extra dimension to the events.

The unity between our two Associations and their members over the weekend was very evident throughout and I feel is getting stronger, with Easter relationships extending beyond just Easter through the year. Our modified Friday format achieved our aim of making this event more of a relaxed and welcoming environment for more interaction across the attendees.

On the big day, the weather was awful, with a lot of overnight rain placing the match in great jeopardy. An early morning dash to the ground by Darran Swain and Captain Craig Thomas, found the covers blown back and 50% of the pitch underwater. Would this be the first CS match in 92 years to be “washed out”? A quick dash to Bunnings for brooms, water was removed and a delayed start was agreed (the easiest decision of the day). Eventually, due to the curating expertise of Ash Barrow (from the VCAUSA), it was decided that the pitch was playable and after an early lunch, the match was reduced to 20 overs/side with a maximum of 4 overs/bowler. SACUSA Captain Craig Thomas won the toss and invited the VCAUSA to bat first (no surprise there). With scorers Neil Ricketts and Trevor Finlayson in place and umpires David Little and Rod McKinnon set, play (or is it battle) began at 1:30pm.

We got off to a flying start with star recruit (not to mention former Australian Test player) Peter George taking an early wicket in the first over and we were away. Batting proved difficult perhaps because of pitch conditions, but largely due to some great bowling by the SA bowlers which saw the VCAUSA 8 for 54 at the end of their 20 overs. 3 bowlers, Peter George, Stephan Lessing, and Mick Shephard finished

with 2 wickets and one each to James Cushway and Anup Venkatesh. Peter George won the Bowling Trophy and Tanmoy Sana the fielding trophy.

Captain Craig went on the attack immediately throwing “caution to the wind” by changing the batting order and opting for a positive and attacking approach in the top order. The result saw debutant SACUSA representative Karthik Reddy Tella opening the innings with seasoned campaigner Mick Shephard. The tactic paid off handsomely and provided entertaining batting which saw us reach the target without losing a wicket in just 9.3 overs, with Karthik on 42 and Mick Shephard 17 and sealing a memorable 10 wicket victory for the first time in the 92-year history of the CS match and Kartik Reddy Tella was awarded the Batting Trophy.

This result leaves the current state of play with South Australia 19 and Victoria, 22 wins. We need to maintain the momentum we have gained this year and continue our push to redress the imbalance in 2025. Let’s get behind our team, start honing our cricket skills and band together for back-to-back wins in 2025.

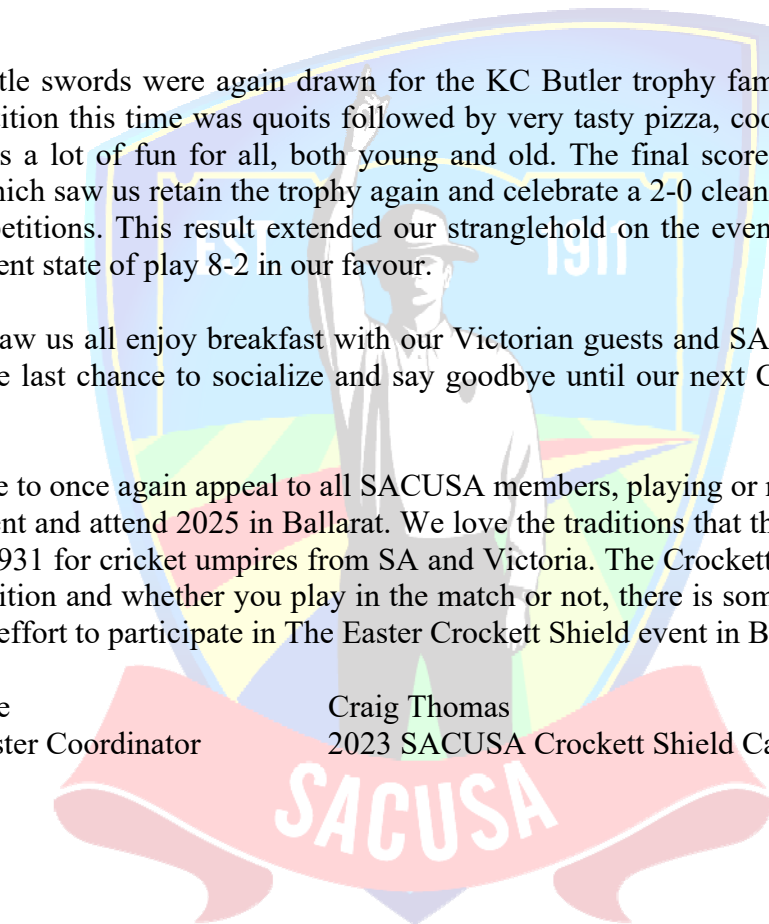

We love the traditions that this event provides, since the first match in 1931 for cricket umpires from SA and Victoria. 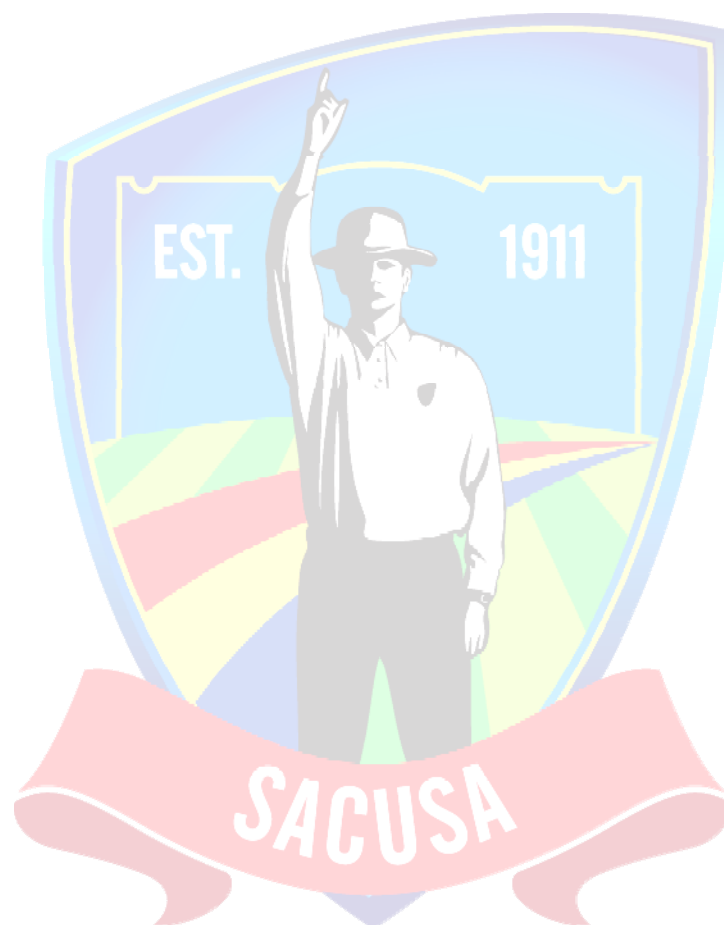



S.A.C.U.S.A. HALL OF FAME

Selection Criteria and Guidelines for Induction to the SACUSA Hall of Fame

- Rule 1. Candidacy is open to all umpires and scorers meeting the selection criteria who behaved in a manner which was conducive with the spirit and objectives of SACUSA.
- Rule 2. The SACUSA Executive Committee must appoint a Selection Panel of three impartial and independent individuals who decide on the successful inductees.
- Rule 3. The SACUSA Executive Committee is charged with the task of presenting a shortlist of possible inductees to the Selection Panel.
- Rule 4. Candidates must have made a very significant contribution to SACUSA, umpiring, scoring or their administration in South Australia over an extended period of time. A candidate's worthiness is purely at the discretion of the Selection Sub-committee in order to be considered for nomination.
- Rule 5. Candidates must have demonstrated an exceptional dedication to SACUSA, umpiring, scoring or their administration in South Australia and must not have illustrated behavior that would suggest a conflict with the ideals held by SACUSA during the era that the candidate actively contributed.
- Rule 6. Candidates must not have been actively umpiring or scoring within the cricketing environment for at least two years prior to nomination.
- Rule 7. The Hall of Fame must be reviewed at least every two years.

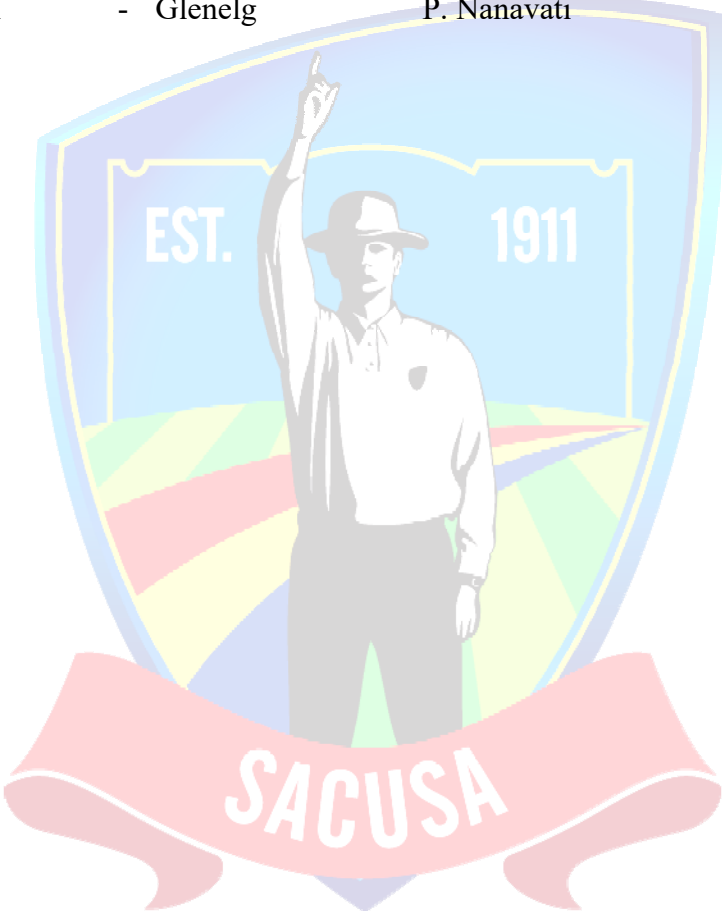

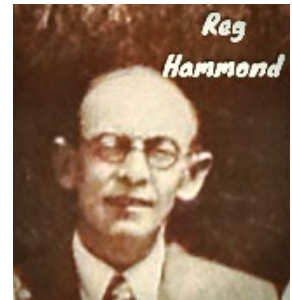

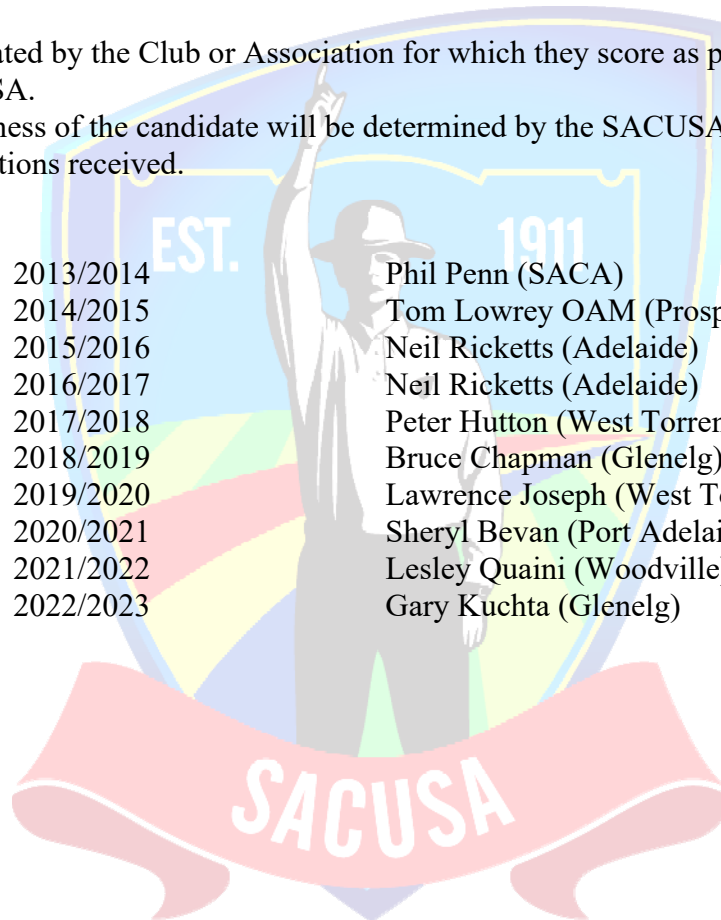

The factors that govern the award comprise

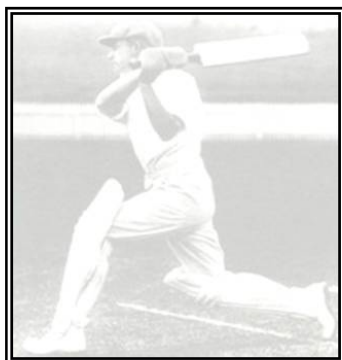
- Actual cricket ability displayed.

THE BRADMAN MEDAL



During season 1957/58 three SACUA Umpires, John McMenamin, Jack Kierse and Gordon Seymour, were enjoying a quiet drink after a SACUA meeting at the Hotel Adelaide in Pirie Street, when the 'idea' of an award for the best A Grade District Cricketer was proposed. The original award, first made after season 1958/59, was based on one vote per game for the best player during an 'A' Grade match.

The first presentation dinner was held at the Seven Stars Hotel in Angas Street, Adelaide and was attended by approximately 30 umpires. Votes were counted during the dinner. At the conclusion of the count, joint winners Ian McLachlan and Brian Quigley were announced. Neither of the winners were in attendance and taxis were sent to their homes to bring them to the dinner to receive their award.

During season 1976/77 it was decided that the District Cricketer Award should be renamed as the Bradman Medal and Sir Donald Bradman was approached for his approval. "The Don" agreed and said that he would be honoured to have the award named after him. The presentation of this prestigious award has continued, and the Bradman Medal Presentation Dinner is now recognised as the pinnacle of any cricket season in South Australia.

Season 2007/08 celebrated 50 years since the start of the District Cricketer Award/Bradman Medal. To celebrate this occasion winners (or family members) of the District Cricketer Award from 1958/59 to 1975/76 were presented with a Bradman Medal at the Bradman Medal Presentation Dinner on 19th March 2008. Also, on the night three players who lost on a countback were awarded Bradman Medals.
