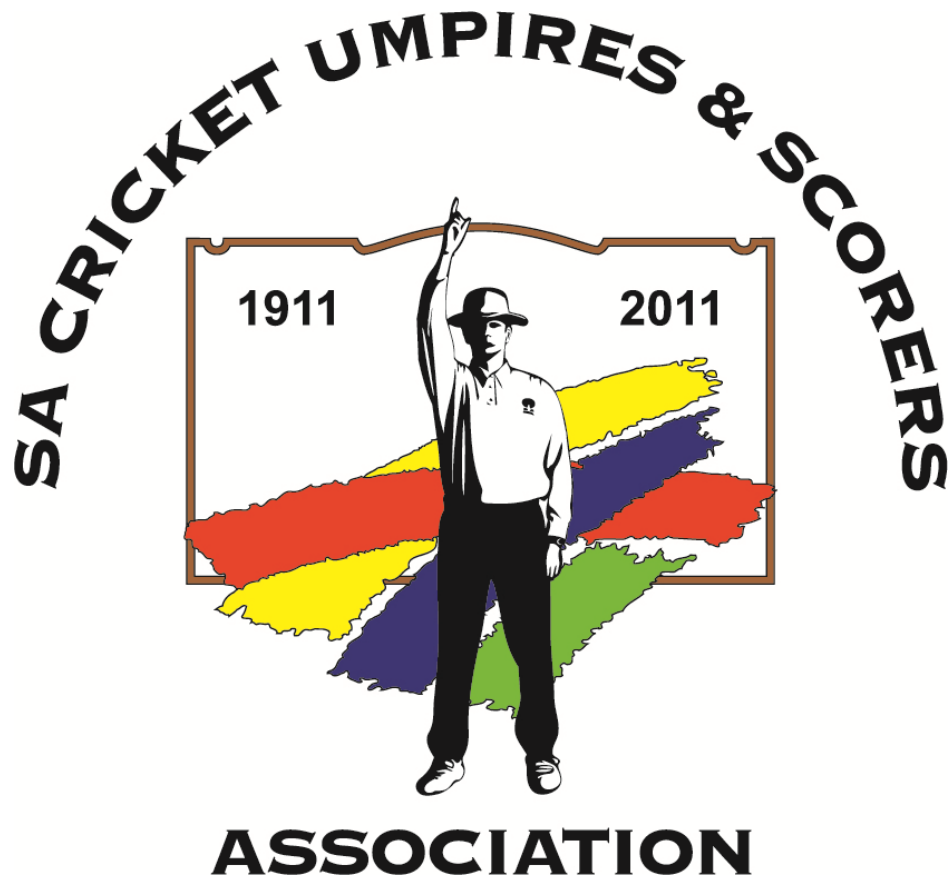
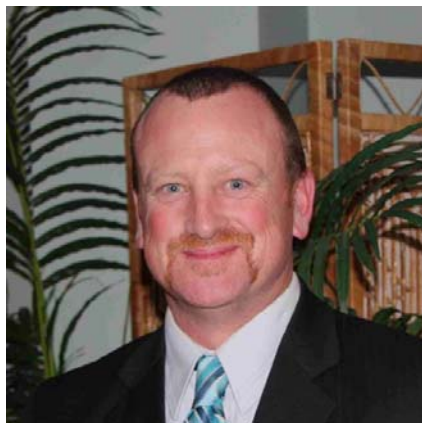

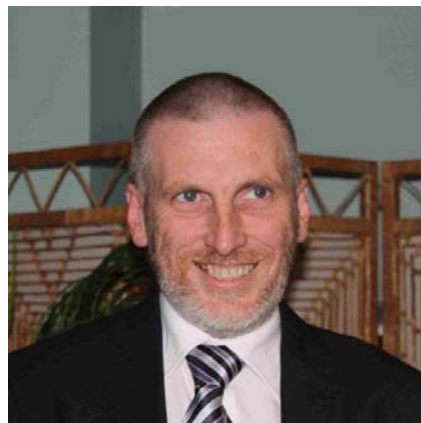

1. Open Meeting

3. Apologies

4. Minutes of 2013 AGM

PRESIDENT'S REPORT (Craig Thomas)



SACUSA Members,

I am honoured to present to you the President's Report for the 2014 – 2015 season – a year in which the South Australian Cricket Umpires & Scorers Association continued to support the growth of cricket in SA and across the nation.

The last few seasons have seen a great deal of change within our cricketing environment, and this last year has been no exception to that evolution. Following on from the May 2014 release of the 'Zadow Report' into South Australian Grade Cricket, and after gathering feedback from clubs, Grade competition made a significant move away from Sunday cricket, resulting in only limited clashes with the second season of Premier League. Football returned to the Adelaide Oval after the impressive, albeit controversial, redevelopment was finalised in early 2014 – a move which spells the end of the Football Park era but signals the reunion of the SACA and the SANFL/AFL. And the Adelaide Oval itself is certainly now a world class stadium which all Croweaters can be proud of on the global stage.

Brand new world class facilities certainly warranted August's 2014/15 Umpiring Launch being held during the evening in the stunning Cathedral Room at the new Adelaide Oval, overlooking a beautifully illuminated St Peter's Cathedral. And although football may have left the Football Park/AAMI Stadium arena, the venue more than met the needs of the Statewide Umpiring Seminar which was held there in September. This annual pre-season training and preparation opportunity was generously coordinated by our innovative Umpiring Manager, Neil Poulton, and was enhanced by invaluable support from our Umpire Coaches, as well as guidance sessions conducted by special guests Simon Fry - SA representative on the National Umpiring Panel - and Cricket Australia's Umpire Educator, Bob Parry.

While speaking of our South Australian representatives on major umpiring panels, it would be remiss of me not to mention the stellar career of our own Steve Davis. Awarded Life Membership of our Association in 2004, Steve retired from the ICC Elite Umpiring Panel in June after having been first appointed to it in 2008. All up, he enjoyed a 25 year long first class umpiring career which commenced in the 1990/91 season. Steve is admired for his high quality leadership and calm demeanour during high pressure situations both on field and off. It is with sincere goodwill that I extend congratulations and best wishes to Steve on behalf of our SACUSA family. He has provided much inspiration to our members over the years as we have watched his career blossom.

Outside of the week-to-week duties that SACUSA cricket officials undertake, there is an ongoing project being undertaken which is increasing our understanding of our significant history. An official SACUSA Hall of Fame function was held in the Ian McLachlan Room at Adelaide Oval in early November to commemorate the inaugural inductions into this new institution. It really did justice to the research that has been done by our resident historians, Max Bartlett and Kristen Thomas, and to the superb support which has been lent to the Hall by Selection Panel members Harvey Jolly, Geoff Sando and Ray Isherwood. Sadly, Ray passed away in September and he was deeply missed at the celebration. However, the event was attended by more than one hundred people, including all three living inductees, Daryl Harper, Tony Crafter and Max O'Connell, as well as representatives from every family of the eight posthumously-honoured inductees. Guests attended from all over the nation, and SACUSA was very honoured to host every one of these families who have contributed so much to SACUSA and South Australian cricket. We are also very grateful to both Cricket Australia and SACA for supporting the event financially. A small piece of icing on the cake was our ten seconds of coverage on Channel 7 News, which, although quick, still helped to promote our very valued Hall of Fame members.

It was with utter shock that I, SACUSA and the rest of the cricketing community witnessed the passing of young East Torrens, South Australian, New South Wales and Australian cricketer, Phil Hughes, at the hands of the game we love just a couple of weeks after our Hall of Fame celebration. On November 27 we lost a dearly-loved and youthful member of the cricket family when the injuries Phil sustained in a Sheffield Shield match between SA and NSW culminated in his death. Our hearts break for the premature passing of this talented young man, and SACUSA extends its sincere condolences to Phil's family and friends.

Our Association has included scorers into its fold for the last several years, but they are still not represented in large numbers within our membership. We had hoped to do significantly more in terms of training for scorers this season, but it remains an avenue which SACUSA is still trying to expand. Nevertheless, I would like to thank State Scorer, Neil Ricketts, for his genuine and committed approach to integrate more scorers into SACUSA. He has gone to considerable lengths to promote the role and a partnership with our organisation. He has even had communication with the head scorer at Lords, and continues to approach cricket scoring as an opportunity to support our game and to excel in the occupation. During 2015/16 SACUSA will again focus on welcoming scorers to our group and we are keen to provide support which enhances their officiating careers.

There have been many examples of noteworthy appointments during the season, and I would like to initially offer my heartiest congratulations to those umpires who stood in their first A Grade matches, namely; Dhaval Bhatt, Allan Coulthard, Jimmy Edwards, Rajesh Sambamurthy, Matt Schulz and Paul Welbourn. Congratulations also to Cain Kemp, who was appointed to the Cricket Australia Male Under 17 National Championships held in Hobart; to Luke Uthenwoldt, who was appointed to the Cricket Australia Male Under 19 National Championships held in Adelaide; and to Neal Cotgrove, who was appointed to the Cricket Australia Female Under 18 National Championships held in Ballarat. Best wishes also go to legendary scorer, Prospect's Tom Lowrey, who became the second winner of the 'Buckett-Hammond Award for Scorer of the Year' at our Presentation Night on May 23, and to David Aylward of the Yorke Peninsula Cricket Association for winning the 'Peter Weeks Award for Best Umpire in Community Cricket' for his magnificent work in promoting cricket umpiring in country areas.

In regard to our annual Presentation Night, it should be noted that we hosted it at a new venue this year; the Adelaide Pavilion on South Terrace. It was received very graciously by our attendees and feedback was extremely positive. The central location seemed agreeable to all, and the three-course dual-choice menu was savoured by everyone. We were treated to an excellent interview conducted by last season's 'Buckett-Hammond Award' winner, Phil Penn, who is also a national selector for the Australian Blind Cricket team. He was joined by the captain of the South Australian Blind Cricket team, Michael Zannis, who led his team to victory at the recent All Abilities Cricket Championships in Melbourne. A very entertaining and enlightening Q & A session revealed that our SA team had taken the honours for the first time in 45 years, so SACUSA feel very proud to be associated with this inspiring group of people by providing a team for them to practice against when we can.

Grand Finals are the goal for all teams each year, but they are also important for umpires. My congratulations go to all those who were selected to officiate in these very special matches. Your appointments reflect the truly great work you have done during the season.

Sponsorship is a vital part of sustaining SACUSA, and it comes in different forms from different quarters throughout the year. We are fortunate to receive support at monthly meetings from those who supply raffle prizes, and also gain help annually at our Presentation Night from other individuals and businesses. Many, many thanks to those who have aided our causes during the season - I thoroughly appreciate your assistance as it makes a big difference to our operations. Specifically, I'd like to thank Coverdrive Couriers for their longstanding sponsorship, and I also wish to thank SACA for the generous sponsorship extended to us in 2014/15.

No report would be complete without mentioning our stalwart supporters who enable SACUSA to host our wonderful members' barbeques each month. Huge thanks are tendered to the Kensington District Cricket Club for making their premises available to us on the second Wednesday of each month so we can conduct our meetings. Many thanks also to Terry Murch, Brian Litchfield and their merry band of helpers who ensure our barbeque meat and onions are perfectly cooked each time, and of course to the spectacular Graham and Desma MacTavish who not only prepare amazing salads to accompany our snags and patties (and who sometimes provide homemade soup as well), but who also donate every ingredient. We seriously could not manage these events without the incredible efforts of these very generous people.

Easter saw the Victorian Cricket Association Umpires and Scorers Association host SACUSA for the biennial Crockett Shield competition. I'd like to thank our friends at the VCAUSA for their gracious hospitality, excellent accommodation and sensational playing venue (Wesley College). It was just a pity that the result wasn't in our favour! However, the K C Butler Trophy win was much better. I'd like to thank the families who took the time, effort and finances to travel over to Melbourne for the weekend, and once again recommend it to anyone who is curious about this longstanding tradition.

Thanks must also be extended to SACA Umpiring and Coaching Development Manager, Neil Poulton, for his guidance, support and genuine concern for umpiring in South Australia. His role demands extended hours and the meeting of unexpected challenges each season, and his experience and expertise results in a growing environment full of increased professional opportunities for cricket officials. Neil's commitment to our fraternity is very valued and highly appreciated.

Personally, I am moved to deeply thank SACUSA Patron, Mr Neil Dansie, for his enthusiastic and sincere support of SACUSA, which he expresses by his attendance at our functions and his genuine interest in our membership. Neil is a cricketing legend who has made himself available to answer any queries we have about South Australian cricket history and folklore, and we are humbled to count him as our friend and ally.

Lastly, but by no means least, I wish to thank the SACUSA Committee for their unwavering support of me in my presidency and of SACUSA in general. My gratitude goes to Lynton Donisthorpe, Michial Farrow, Tony Trist, Bruce Stribley, Ed Branson, Michael Williamson and Paul Welbourn for their efforts in ensuring that our Association runs smoothly. It requires a team effort, and we are very fortunate to possess a thoroughly cooperative team to run SACUSA.

We have had a very busy year on the social side of things. The season was launched at the Adelaide Oval. During the season we had our Christmas Meeting, Inaugural Hall of Fame Presentation, cricket matches with SA Blind Cricket and Adelaide Turf Cricket Umpires and Scorers Association, and Easter in Victoria. More information on these events can be found in the Social Convenor's Report.

We continue to appreciate the generosity of the people at the Kensington Cricket Club for allowing us to use their facilities for our monthly meetings. Desma and Graham MacTavish have continued to supply salads and other delights for our meetings and this, combined with the BBQ, has continued to mean that members have enjoyed the social aspects of our meetings. At this stage we look set to continue our association with Kensington Cricket Club's Parkinson Oval as a venue for the monthly meetings in the new season. The great contribution of our members, however, has not been restricted to Grade Cricket alone. At the international level we had Simon Fry and Steve Davis going about business as usual. It would be remiss of me not to congratulate Steve Davis on a fine career now that he has decided to retire from umpiring. You have been a role model for many of our members and on behalf of those lucky enough to have enjoyed time in the middle with you and in the clubrooms after, thank you and well done, Steve.

To my fellow members of the Executive Committee and Neil Poulton, thank you all for your help and support and a big thank you to Cody Niemann for all her assistance throughout the season. TREASURER'S REPORT

(Lynton Donisthorpe)



Mr President and Members of SACUSA,

It is with great pleasure that I present to you the Treasurer's report of our Association's business for the 2014–2015 financial year.

Balance Sheet Summary

I would describe this year as a 'business as usual' year for the Association's finances. I reported at the last AGM we expected to face some financial challenges in 14/15. However we realised unexpected income of \$2,500 sponsorship from SACA and \$1,500 from Cricket Australia to assist with the Hall of Fame. This additional \$4,000 income significantly relieved the tight financial position we anticipated and loss on the majority of events was on or below budget. It has been a typical turnover year for an away Easter Year with receipts of \$41,676.58 and payments of \$44,800.13 (excluding term deposit transactions). The result was an end of financial year balance of \$10,330.93 in our working account and a net loss of \$3,123.55. While on the surface, a significant loss, it was less than the loss we had budgeted for.

Membership

Membership numbers in 2014/15 were down from the highs of recent years, which saw us with 96 Full Members (down from 107 in 2013/14) and 17 Associate Members (up from 15 in 2013/14). Life Members are not included in these figures. The decrease would appear to be due to reduced active umpires and some not completing the entire season. Scorer and other Association umpires remained relatively stable this year.

Sponsorship

Sponsorship income increased significantly due to SACA becoming a major sponsor. St John's Road continued as products sponsors for which we are very grateful. I once again want to thank sincerely our loyal sponsors and friends at Coverdrive Couriers for their contribution this year and for many years.

Budget Comparison

The Association finished the year with a loss of \$3,123, below our budgeted \$4,043 loss. We saw typical overs/unders when compared to our forecast figures. The most significant being: Membership income below budget (\$3,000 below budget), the Hall of Fame loss above forecast (\$670 above budget), the Presentation Dinner below budget due to lower attendance and event costs (\$1,600 under budget), Bradman Medal purchase costs up (\$800 above budget) a result of a number of ties and additional medal purchases. The Medal loss was offset by lower than expected Bradman attendance costs (\$700 below budget). Lottery income was down (\$1,500 below budget) due to timing of the lottery this year and sponsorship was up (\$2,500 over budget) as discussed earlier.

Trust Accounts

The Glad Jones and George McDonagh trust funds (held in Westpac Community Solutions Cash Reserve Account) saw interest as the only income again this year and one withdrawal of \$110 for Easter trophies (the reason the money was bequeathed to SACUSA). Interest income for the year was \$26.63 leaving us with a final balance of \$1,422.21, split between the two funds.

Current Position Overview

SACUSA continued to maintain a sound financial position again this year. Each year becomes more of a challenge to maintain good event subsidies for members. The committee hope we have achieved this while importantly maintaining a healthy funds balance.

Glad Jones and George McDonagh Memorial Trust Funds

As a part of the biennial cricket match against the Victorian Cricket Association Umpires and Scorers Association, trophies are awarded to the best performed South Australian players for overall performance and fielding. These awards are made as a result of trust funds held by the South Australian Cricket Umpires and Scorers Association from monies donated by former members Gladstone Jones and George McDonagh.

The first fund, the Glad Jones Memorial Trust Fund, was established in March 1976 with a donation of \$150.00 from Mr. Gladstone Jones for a trophy to be awarded to the best performed player representing South Australia. Two years later Mr. George McDonagh made a similar donation, establishing the George McDonagh Memorial Trust Fund to enable an award to be made to the best performed fielder during these matches.

The donations remain invested at the discretion of the SACUSA Committee, however, in the event that a decision was taken to discontinue the matches in the future, the funds and any interest earned was to be donated to the National Heart Foundation. After the establishment of both funds the Executive Committee of the South Australian Cricket Umpires Association was empowered to use the interest earned from both funds to award the trophies after each match. An increase to the capital invested of \$200.00 was made to each fund during the late 1980's from interest already earned to ensure that a sound basis for interest earning existed and therefore the continuation of the awards.

SA UMPIRING MANAGER (Neil Poulton)



Mr President and Members of SACUSA,

It is with pleasure that I present my report on umpiring and it is at these times of reflection that the enormity of what was undertaken by the Umpiring Department this year becomes evident.

Firstly the obvious; the adoption/integration of Adelaide Turf umpires into the SACA umpire management practices. Whilst umpires from Adelaide Turf have been involved in SACA's umpire development initiatives for a number of years now, the move to hand the co-ordination and management of umpires to SACA was a brave but positive step in establishing the place of community cricket umpiring in the overall cricket pathway. The benefits of this major change will affect both ATCA and ATCUSA and the benefits will be profound. Linking Turf to the umpiring pathway immediately opens the Association up to instant growth of new umpires and opportunities to advance for existing umpires who desire such a challenge.

In terms of SACUSA, and for umpires umpiring in SACA Grade and Para Districts competition, it was generally business as usual. That, however, was a massive workload. SACUSA members featured in over 50 competitions this year, incorporating Grade Cricket, Para Districts, SACA Carnivals, North East Juniors, South Central Juniors, Trial Games, SAMCA Cup matches, Country competitions, Adelaide Turf matches, National Championships, the WNCL and Futures League, BBL and even the ICC international matches. SACUSA members have been present at almost every level of club cricket throughout the state.

My congratulations are offered to all umpires who achieved milestones this year, who represented their association or simply contributed to the success and growth of cricket. You are all valuable, as is the role you play.

This coming season I can happily say there will be limited change. What will happen is that together we will put the polish on what we do and how we do it. Our association will grow and I am committed to increasing our numbers by 30% this coming season. I am only measuring active umpires available regularly on a Saturday, so at a figure of around 45 new umpires this will have a significant impact on SACA and SACUSA. These targets are part of my performance assessment with SACA and they are targets I am committed to reach.

Last season the umpiring department made over 4,000 individual umpire appointments. This coming season that number is likely to increase to over 5,000 as we continue to expand and grow. SACA has responded to this growth by adding resources to the umpire department. Throughout 2015/16, in addition to my role and Cody's role, we will welcome a new Umpiring Coordinator whose main, if not sole, role is to manage those 5,000 appointments. This will allow me to focus on recruitment and development of new umpires and perform my duties at the higher end with the SACA State Umpiring Panel. Have no doubt that I will still have control of the process and know what is happening with appointments, but releasing me from my desk is a major step to growing umpiring for the benefit of our game.

Once again, thank you to all umpires, coaches and SACUSA for a challenging but rewarding season and I look forward to doing it all again in the months to come.

HISTORY COMMITTEE REPORT

Mr President and Members of SACUSA,

“Make your decision and shut up.” This is one of my favourite quotes from an umpire and it was discovered during the continuing research undertaken by the History Committee. Attributed to the highly respected South Australian ‘Bodyline’ umpire, George Hele, it is advice which I believe could be practiced both inside and outside the game of cricket to enhance our busy lives and simplify our daily schedules. It is also advice which I’m certain could aid in dealing with the numerous challenges which Mr President and I find ourselves faced with when discussing SACUSA happenings and history most days at our dining table. But it’s all done with a keen willingness, and we are very grateful to be involved with such a driven

and positive community sharing a passion to sustain cricket in our beautiful South Australia.

It’s safe to say that there probably wouldn’t be a History Committee without the long-term vision of Umpire Coach, Max Bartlett, and the enthusiasm to form the group which came from Executive Committee member, Ed Branson. Now necessarily involved with developing the Scorer Sub-Committee, Ed was instrumental in establishing the history group, which is currently mostly active due to roles held by both Max and myself. However, it has been very rewarding to see the interest in our work grow throughout the general membership, and it is always heartening to be approached by people keen to suggest avenues of research or contribute their time and thoughts to our projects. At present the interest is at an all-time high, with no sign that it will do anything other than increase. I’d encourage anyone with any information or desires for our history directives to approach me or Max for a chat. We absolutely love discussing SACUSA’s history, and wish to learn more of it from any quarters.

By far, the season’s most celebrated occasion created from our history research was the Hall of Fame Event held at Adelaide Oval in November. An independent Selection Panel chose eleven inaugural inductees – and we enjoyed a one hundred percent attendance rate from representatives of every one of those eleven inductees’ families. Our three living inductees, Tony Crafter, Daryl Harper and Max O’Connell, brought their beautiful loved ones along, and relatives of all eight posthumously honoured inductees accepted our invitation to attend. People travelled from all over Australia to celebrate with us, including our much admired Cate Ryan from Cricket Australia who returned ‘home’ on CA’s behalf to speak about our new initiative. Jointly funded by SACUSA and Cricket Australia, our event contained a surprise element when SACA offered hospitality sponsorship on the day - an offer which we all raised our glasses to. We were thrilled and grateful at the response with which this project has been met by people from all walks of life, and it was a privilege to offer our Hall of Fame publication to our guests at the Event. The digital version of the booklet can be accessed free of charge for anyone interested via the SACUSA website.

What began as a desire by Max and Ed to publish a definitive history of SACUSA has taken on a life of its own and led to more projects which we are very passionate about seeing to fruition. Work has definitely begun on the book, and it was reinforced during the season by Max’s chance encounter with cricket photographer and perfect gentleman, Mostyn Seigert, during his travels around the grounds. As a hobby, “Moss” as he is known by many, has spent more than fifty years attending matches at Adelaide Oval and asking politely whether players and officials would mind having their photo taken by him. The result is arguably the most extensive array of Adelaide Oval’s cricket participants recorded across decades, and is an absolute credit to Moss’ skill and pure love for the game. After an offer to share his photos with SACUSA for enhancement to our book, Mr President and I have been fortunate enough to share several morning teas with Moss and his gorgeous wife, Pat - a fellow cricket widow, to be sure. The History Committee is indebted to Moss for allowing his work to be utilised for our project and I look forward to seeing his name on the cover in the not too distant future.

We are also gathering far more knowledge about SACUSA's history than can be contained in a single volume. This will not be a cause for concern, though, because technology has ensured that we have more ways than ever to make all this content accessible to all. A 'virtual museum' is being designed so that anyone with an interest in the topic can read historic annual reports, see photos, and peruse other items which are being accumulated as more people hear of the work we are doing and donate to our collection. I have been very pleased to see more and more members sharing their significant milestones throughout the year and forwarding photos to me so that we can share them on Facebook. This is a recording of our history as it is happening, and it will hopefully ensure that we don't lose touch with our stories again.

Right at the end of the season, at our Presentation Night on May 23, we were informed by our Hall of Fame Selection Panel that another induction was being made. After the sudden passing of original selector, Ray Isherwood, our existing selectors, Harvey Jolly and Geoff Sando were joined by inaugural inductee, Max O'Connell, to assess other candidates. It was with immense pleasure that SACUSA revealed that they had chosen 1950 Life Member, Reg Nelson, to join the ranks of those receiving our highest honour. Since that time I have actually been able to find Reg's family, and to say they are excited about the induction is an understatement. Several of the family have indicated they would love to attend our next Presentation Night, at which we will formally induct Reg into the Hall. They have already shared some amazing insights into Reg's life and I am really enthusiastic about putting it all down on paper in readiness for the publication of the book.

Another new initiative announced at the Presentation Night is a creation by Judy Little - the "Joyce McMenamin Trophy" for significant contribution to cricket officiating via major support of a SACUSA member. Judy is the wife of former SACUSA President David Little, a staunch supporter of our history projects. Joyce was married to our 1968 Life Member, John McMenamin, until her passing in 2010. Both ladies have familiarity with the challenges encountered in 'supporting a supporter' of cricket, and Judy's suggestion at the Bradman Medal that an award should be made to those who work behind the scenes was met with so much positivity that she was encouraged to see it created. Without the historical research we have done with John and his family we would not have known how apt Joyce is to have the award named in her honour, and I believe this is another example demonstrating how worthwhile it is to retrieve our stories from decades past so that our current operations can be improved by them.

Finally, I would like to thank the SACUSA membership for allowing me the honour of researching the stories and people of the Association once again this year. With all the hours spent preparing for the season and then officiating in the matches, partners of umpires and scorers can find themselves with a lot of time unable to call on their cricket lover for anything. In my case, that time alone has meant that the ghosts of seasons past can have a quiet chat with me to reveal their fascinating lives - both in cricket and outside of it. It is my privilege to bring those stories to you - and I wouldn't mind betting that the other part of the current History Committee, Mr Max Bartlett, has a similar passion for the interviews he is pursuing with current and former officials. We welcome any thoughts that you have about these history projects.

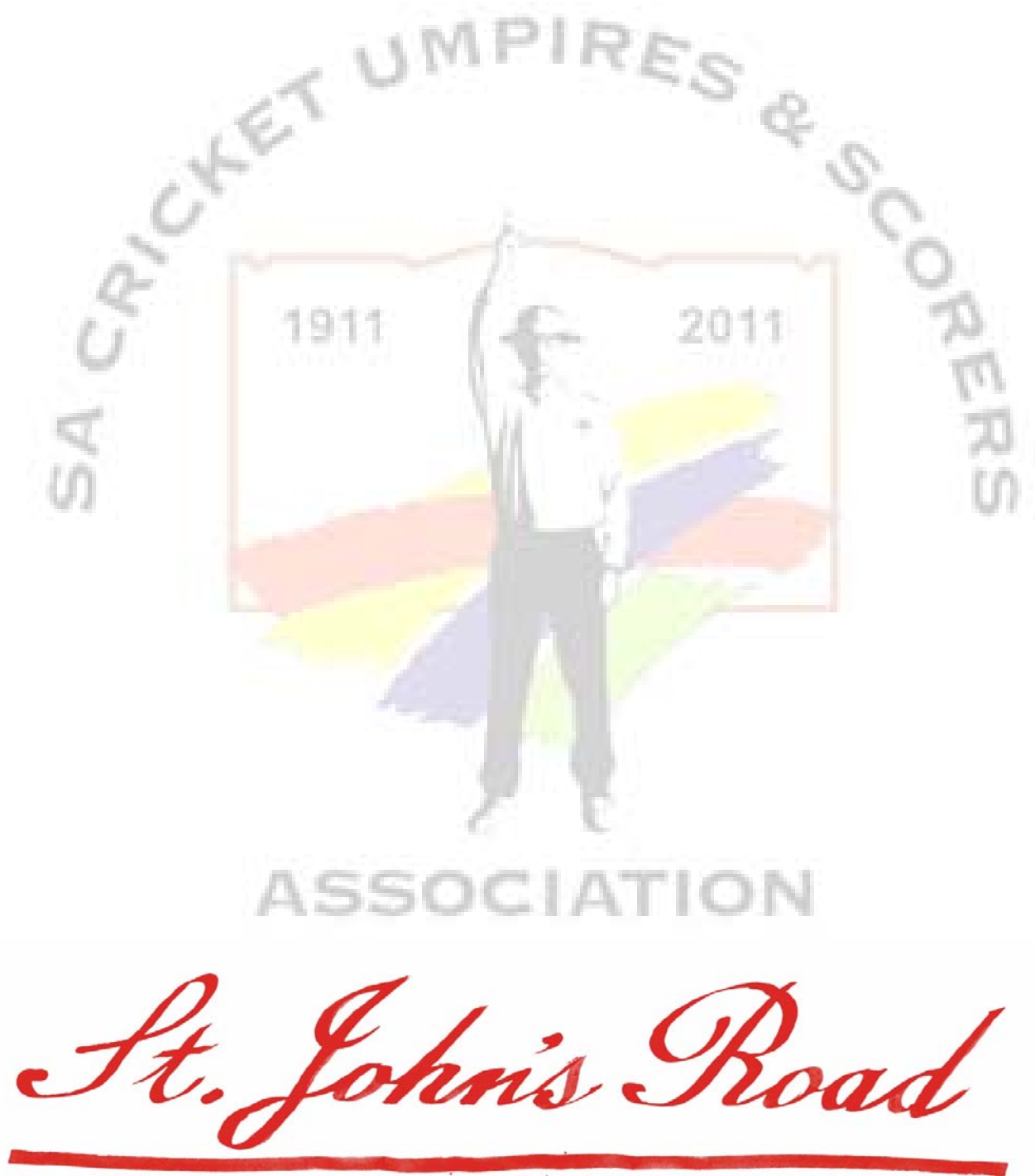

S.A.C.U.S.A. HALL OF FAME

Selection Criteria and Guidelines for Induction to the SACUSA Hall of Fame

- Rule 1. Candidacy is open to all umpires and scorers meeting the selection criteria who behaved in a manner which was conducive with the spirit and objectives of SACUSA.
- Rule 2. The SACUSA Executive Committee must appoint a Selection Panel of three impartial and independent individuals who decide on the successful inductees.
- Rule 3. The SACUSA Executive Committee is charged with the task of presenting a shortlist of possible inductees to the Selection Panel.
- Rule 4. Candidates must have made a very significant contribution to SACUSA, umpiring, scoring or their administration in South Australia over an extended period of time. A candidate's worthiness is purely at the discretion of the Selection Sub-committee in order to be considered for nomination.
- Rule 5. Candidates must have demonstrated an exceptional dedication to SACUSA, umpiring, scoring or their administration in South Australia and must not have illustrated behavior that would suggest a conflict with the ideals held by SACUSA during the era that the candidate actively contributed.
- Rule 6. Candidates must not have been actively umpiring or scoring within the cricketing environment for at least two years prior to nomination.
- Rule 7. The Hall of Fame must be reviewed at least every two years.

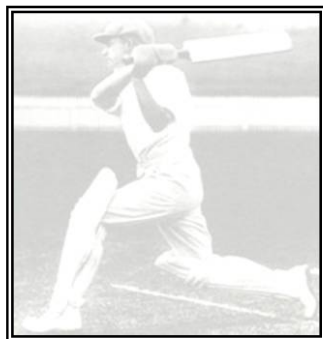

THE BRADMAN MEDAL



During season 1957/58 three SACUA Umpires, John McMenamin, Jack Kierse and Gordon Seymour were enjoying a quiet drink after a SACUA meeting at the Hotel Adelaide in Pirie Street, when the 'idea' of an award for the best A Grade District Cricketer was proposed.

The original award, first made at the conclusion of season 1958/59, was based on one vote per game for the best player during an 'A' Grade match.

The first presentation dinner was held at the Seven Stars Hotel in Angas Street, Adelaide and was attended by approximately 30 umpires. Votes were counted during the dinner and, at the conclusion of the count, joint winners Ian McLachlan and Brian Quigley were announced.

Neither of the winners were in attendance and taxis were sent to their homes to bring them to the dinner to receive their award.

During season 1976/77 it was decided that the District Cricketer Award should be renamed as the Bradman Medal and Sir Donald Bradman was approached for his approval.

"The Don" agreed and said that he would be honoured to have the award named after him.

The presentation of this prestigious award has continued and the Bradman Medal Presentation Dinner is now recognised as the pinnacle of any cricket season in South Australia.

Season 2007/08 celebrated 50 years since the inception of the District Cricketer Award/Bradman Medal. To celebrate this occasion winners (or family members) of the District Cricketer Award from 1956/57 to 1975/76 were presented with a Bradman Medal at the Bradman Medal Presentation Dinner on 19th March 2008. Also on the night three players who lost on a count-back were awarded Bradman Medals.
