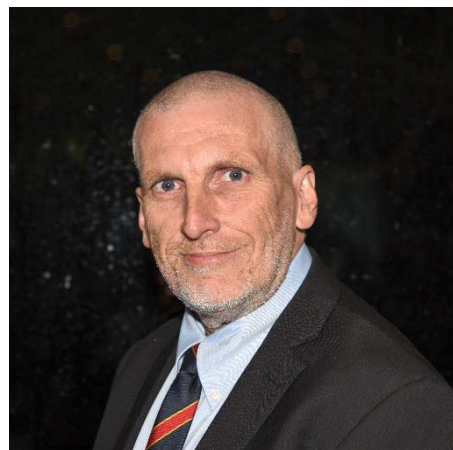

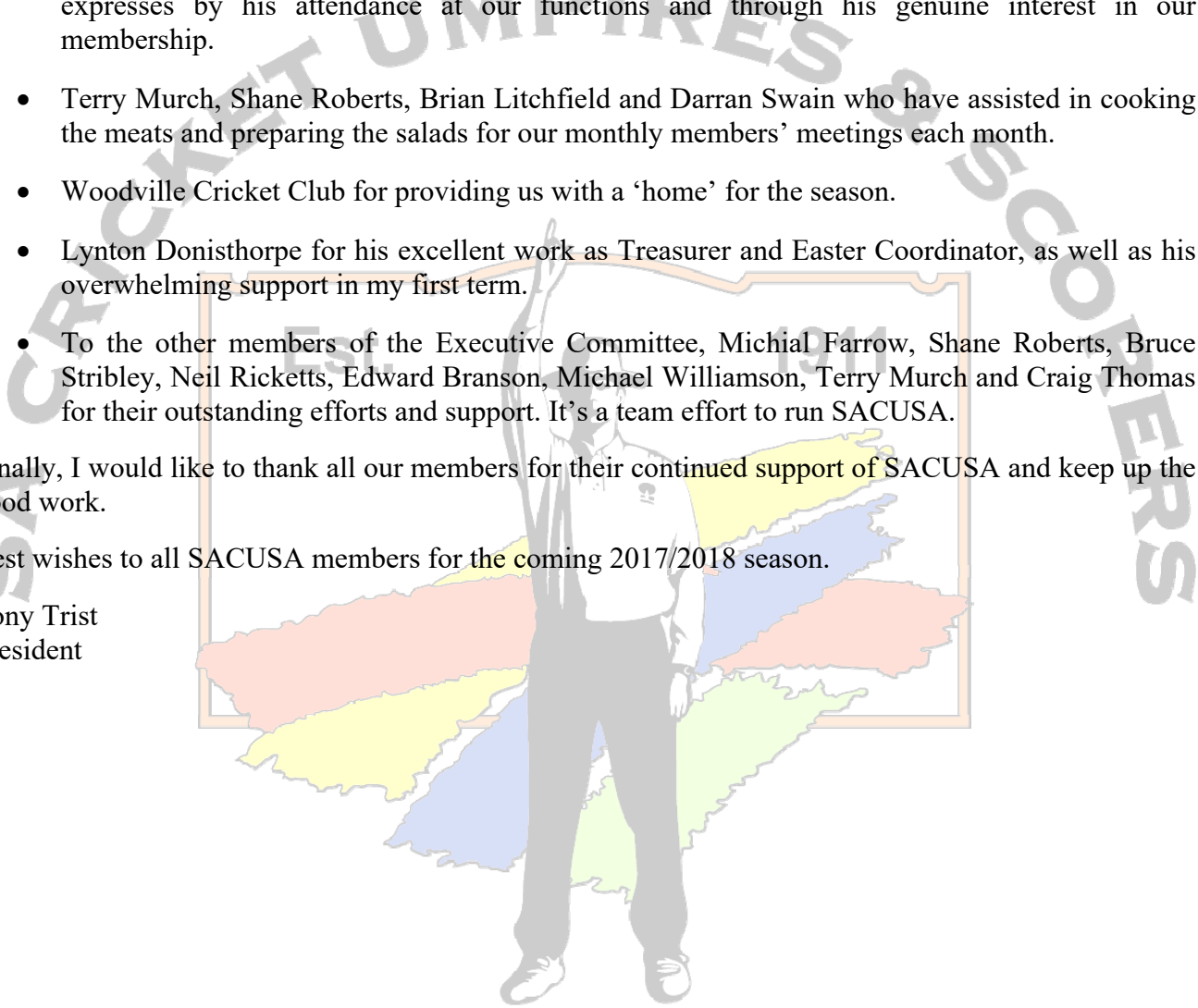
I would also like to thank the following people:

I would also like to congratulate Mick Harper on becoming the 105th Test Scorer for Australia.

It would be remiss of me not to thank Neil Poulton for the work that he did for SACUSA whilst working at SACA. He was the catalyst for a lot of change, and for the most part the changes were for the benefit of SACUSA and cricket in South Australia.

To my fellow members of the Executive Committee, and to Sarah Fry and Catherine Brown at SACA, thank you all for your help and support throughout the season. Finally, to the members of SACUSA, I thank you for your support, and I look forward to your continued support in the up-coming season and beyond.

TREASURER'S REPORT (Lynton Donisthorpe)



Mr President and Members of SACUSA,

It is with great pleasure that I present to you the Treasurer's report of our Association's business for the 2016–2017 financial year.

Balance Sheet Summary

This year has been a near balanced year for the Association financially which was not predicted. At the last AGM, our forecast was for a significant negative financial year as we hosted the Easter event. While we did see a substantial increase in turnover (due largely to Easter) our finances ended much stronger than predicted. With receipts of \$65,871.33 and payments of \$66,241.54, we delivered an end of financial year balance in our working account of \$18,494.55 and a net loss of \$370.21.

Membership

Membership numbers were up 108 Full Members in 2016/17 (up from 106 in 2015/16), which is a typical number for recent years, we had 9 Associate Members (down from 11 in 2015/16), Life Members are not included in these figures. We piloted a new club scorer initiative, where clubs could join 4 scorers as members at a discounted rate, in its first year only 2 clubs took up the offer this year.

Sponsorship

Sponsorship income was similar to 2015/16, with SACA continuing as a major sponsor. We did obtain an additional product sponsor this year, Parkinson Corporate, who joined St John's Road as products sponsors for which we are very grateful. Every year I express sincere thanks to our loyal sponsors and friends from Coverdrive Couriers. It is hard to find different words to describe the fantastic financial support they have provided SACUSA over many years, and their contribution is very much appreciated.

Budget Comparison

The Association finished the year with a loss of \$370.21, which was significantly less than our budgeted/predicted deficit of \$3,720. The primary reasons for this were the receipt of some income that was not budgeted and losses on several events come in lower than expected. The most significant of these were: Easter Donation from SACA received (\$1,000 above budget), Easter Losses lower than expected (\$810 below budget), (excluding SACA donation), Presentation Dinner loss lower than expected (\$990 below budget), Bradman Medal event loss lower than expected (\$1040 below budget) due primarily to lower costs for SACUSA guests, Greyhound Event run in lieu of Family Fun Day below budget (\$515 below budget). At the same time, we had some unanticipated costs including: purchase of new off-field shirts (\$780 over budget), higher than expected Meeting BBQ costs (\$454 over budget) and we have some excess wine in stock from the Presentation Dinner (\$550 over budget). Most other items came in on, or around, our budget estimates.

Trust Accounts

The Gladstone Jones and George McDonagh trust funds (held in Westpac Community Solutions Cash Reserve Account) realised interest as the only income again this year. We had a withdrawal of \$110 for Easter Trophies (the reason the money was bequeathed to SACUSA). Interest income for the year in the account was \$6.25, leaving us with a final account balance of \$1,333.25, split between the two funds as follows: Jones \$638.35 and McDonagh \$694.90.

Overview of Current Financial Position

SACUSA have maintained our strong financial position again this year, which is an excellent outcome given the significant additional turnover and costs that we have in a home Easter year. We have been

in a similar position for some years, which provides the Association with a high level of stability as well as flexibility to support members, Association goals and initiatives.

Glad Jones and George McDonagh Memorial Trust Funds

As a part of the biennial cricket match against the Victorian Cricket Association Umpires and Scorers Association, trophies are awarded to the best performed South Australian players for overall performance and fielding. These awards are made possible by trust funds held by the South Australian Cricket Umpires and Scorers Association from monies donated by former members, Gladstone Jones and George McDonagh.

The first fund, the Glad Jones Memorial Trust Fund, was established in March 1976 with a donation of \$150.00 from Mr. Gladstone Jones for a trophy to be awarded to the best performed player representing South Australia. Two years later Mr. George McDonagh made a similar donation, establishing the George McDonagh Memorial Trust Fund to enable an award to be made to the best performed fielder during these matches.

The donations remain invested at the discretion of the SACUSA Committee, however, if a decision was taken to discontinue the matches in the future, the funds and any interest earned was to be donated to the National Heart Foundation. After the establishment of both funds the Executive Committee of the South Australian Cricket Umpires Association was empowered to use the interest earned from both funds to award the trophies after each match. An increase to the capital invested of \$200.00 was made to each fund during the late 1980's from interest already earned to ensure that a sound basis for interest earning existed and therefore the continuation of the awards.

Scope

We have audited the financial report, being a special purpose financial report of the South Australian Cricket Umpires and Scorers Association Inc. (SACUSA) for the year ended 30 June 2017 comprising the Statement of Receipts and Payments and the Statement of Cash Balances.

In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal control relevant to the entity's preparation and fair presentation of the financial report in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the entity's internal control. An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates made by the Board as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the financial report.

We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our audit opinion.

Audit Opinion

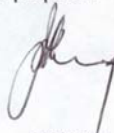

The team charged with the responsibility of implementing the event was comprised of Ted Branson, Terry Murch, Shane Roberts, Craig Thomas, Kristen Thomas, and myself as chairman, supported by President Tony Trist on a 'contract' basis.

The Easter event involves a significant amount of work, with accommodation research/booking commencing in November 2015 (17 months prior to the event). I can only offer a huge vote of thanks to these committee members for their tireless efforts in pulling it all together and making it the success it was.

This year we hosted our visitors at the Hotel Grand Chancellor in the heart of the CBD, as it offered us excellent accommodation standard and dinner venues and good value for money. Other venues used were Henley High School for the Crockett Shield match and the Adelaide Rowing Club for the KC Butler Trophy event. All our venues proved to be perfectly suited for our needs, while at the same time being run by professional staff who I could not speak highly enough of, all of which went a long way to make all events the success they were. While the "big ticket" items above were very significant, the smaller touches we provided (i.e. Crockett Shield 2017 USB memorabilia gifts, welcome gift bags, event printed named programmes/menus for Saturday) all contribute to rounding out the weekend's experiences for our visitors and SACUSA members alike. I must thank Tony Trist, and Kristen and Craig Thomas for arranging and coordinating these "special touch" items.

It all commenced with our very own Bruce Stribley taking the microphone as MC for the Friday Welcome Dinner and we were delighted to welcome long time ABC radio sport commentator and cricket tragic, Roger Wills as MC for the Presentation Dinner on Saturday. A big thank you to these gentlemen for their assistance and the great jobs they both did.

The unity between our two associations and their members over the weekend was very evident throughout and I feel it is getting stronger, with Easter relationships extending beyond just Easter through the year. Our modified Friday format, with no fixed seating and common food and drinks areas, achieved our aim of making this event somewhat less formal and encouraging more interaction, proving a very successful format. Our Crockett Shield captain, Michael Williamson, has provided the following account of the Easter proceedings:

On the big day things were set, Adelaide turned on fantastic weather, Henley High School was a picture, the scorers - Neil Ricketts and Trevor Finlayson - were set up under their marquee, scoreboard operator extraordinaire Sebastian Todd was ready, the umpires Michial Farrow and Ash Barrow were set and the Crockett Shield (or is that the battle!!!) commenced. The VCAUSA won the toss and deciding (perhaps breaking with tradition) to bat first, let battle commence!

The day started badly with us losing a player to injury during the warm up. After consulting fellow selectors and vice-captain we decided to leave the injured player on the sideline and assess him throughout the day. We fielded first and needed quick wickets. After 11 overs, we had the Victorians 3/26, thanks to good bowling from Craig Thomas and Jayden Wilton, before a couple of their very strong players came together and put on a good partnership. My message to our guys was to remain positive, keep doing the right things and a few more wickets would come. Most of the Victorian runs came in the middle session where we chased leather. After removing their strong players and

reinforcing the 'stay positive' message to the team, the wickets started to come our way. Following a consultation with our injured player, myself, our vice-captain and the selectors, we decided to keep him off the field and preserve him for our batting innings after lunch.

Between innings, a very tasty lunch of sandwiches, wraps, cakes and fruit satisfied the hunger of players and spectators both young and old.

The change room message to the team before our batting innings was; stay positive when playing your shots, the Duke ball swings so play accordingly, if there is a run to be taken, take it and let's not try to lose too many early wickets. Unfortunately, we did lose two early wickets and two experienced campaigners, David Little and Mick Sheppard, were at the crease. Despite the good bowling, we knew we still had a chance of winning the match even though at drinks (20 overs), we were 2/26. I went out to the pair and reminded them to keep the scoreboard moving so we would not leave too much work for the rest of the team at the end. After these two were dismissed, a couple more soon followed and we were left with only 10 overs to score 142 runs to reach the Victorian score and win the match, so we just had to go for it. Unfortunately, more wickets followed and we were dismissed for 100, which was 99 runs short. As captain, I was very pleased with a couple of our first gamers, who in the near future should lead the team to many victories against the Victorians at home or away.

This result leaves the current statistics as South Australia 18, and Victoria 20 wins. This is starting to look a bit one sided and we need to make a huge effort to restore this balance. So, let's get behind our 2019 Captain, Dhaval Bhatt, start honing our cricket skills and band together to regain the Shield in 2019.

On Sunday, the battle swords were again drawn on another superb Adelaide day as we ventured to the Adelaide Rowing club on the banks of the beautiful River Torrens for the KC Butler Trophy family event. The day was full of fun games, food, drink and frivolity and was a lot of fun for all who attended, both young and old. Unfortunately, the Victorians won the contest and celebrated a 2-0 clean sweep of the weekend head to head competitions (only the second KCB win for Victoria since its inception in 2001) with the current score line being 7-2 in our favour.

Monday morning saw us all enjoy a hearty breakfast with our Victorian guests and SACUSA members at the Grand Chancellor, and was the last chance to socialize and say goodbye until our next meeting in 2019.

I can only urge all SACUSA members, playing or not, to become involved in this fantastic event. We love the traditions that cricket can provide, including playing and socializing etc. For cricket umpires from Victoria and SA, the Crockett Shield Easter weekend is truly a great tradition. Whether you play in the match or not, I urge all SACUSA members to seriously consider making the journey to Victoria in 2019 so that we can restore the Crockett Shield balance and bring the trophies back to SA again where they belong. Win or not, you will have a great time.

SACA STATE UMPIRING LEADER'S REPORT (Sarah Fry)



Mr President and Members of SACUSA,

Season 2016-17 was a busy one, with SACA appointing umpires to more Associations and matches than ever before. New milestones were reached, many new umpires were accredited, while current umpires renewed their accreditation and attended numerous training sessions to overall develop as individuals.

The annual umpiring launch was taken to a different location to introduce the new season and was held at the South Australian Maritime Museum and One and All Sailing Ship, where guests reflected on the history of umpiring in this state.

Law Study nights then commenced with umpires working through questions and scenarios within their panels led by their umpire coach. In September, the seminar was held at the Rydges South Park where umpires attended a full day of workshops which included a presentation from Cricket Australia's National Umpire Coach, Ian Lock, as well as sessions on field craft, team work and mental preparation. Day 2 of the seminar was attended by Panel 1 umpires and focused on self-awareness, managing conflict and vision dynamics. Attended by Association representatives, the biennial State Umpiring Forum was also held on this weekend and provided fruitful discussion on the future of umpiring in South Australia.

SACA also continued to progress in its goal to consolidate and manage umpire resources throughout metropolitan cricket. Already managing and coordinating umpires for the Adelaide Turf Cricket Association, Para Districts Cricket Association and Adelaide and Suburban Cricket Association, SACA also acquired this responsibility for the Hills Cricket Association, Alexandra and Eastern Hills Cricket Association, Murray Towns Cricket Association, Churches and Community Cricket Association, North Eastern Junior Cricket Association and South Central Junior Cricket Association. This resulted in more than 6,100 individual umpire appointments to over 90 grades of competition. SACUSA members featured predominately in these appointments with umpires involved in many levels of club cricket throughout the state.

Targets were exceeded regarding the recruitment and training of new umpires, with 124 completing their Community Officiating Accreditation and 26 umpires achieving their Representative Officiating Accreditation. More than 70 umpires renewed their current accreditation and over 700 participants attended 32 umpire training sessions.

The performance of all umpires across Premier Cricket was continually measured throughout the season from team captains and SACA's umpire coaches. The results were pleasing with more umpires assessed by a coach than in previous seasons and a satisfactory overall rating at season's end. Mary Waldron and Eloise Sheridan made history by becoming the first ever female pair to umpire a Premier Cricket match in South Australia, while Ros and David Rodgers became the first husband and wife team to umpire at the Under 16 Country Cup. Peter Raftery also had the opportunity to officiate with his grandson, James Cushway, on a couple of occasions throughout the season.

Cain Kemp, Craig Thomas and Luke Uthenwoldt, who form our state panel, continued to do an outstanding job in the WNCL, WBBL and Futures League competitions, with SACA umpires also representing in national tournaments including the Under 17 Male Championships, Australian Country Championships, National Indigenous Cricket Championships and Under 15 Boys Championships.

Simon Fry was named the Cricket Australia Umpire of the Year for the fourth successive season and continued his progression through the ICC umpiring ranks, standing in several Test matches over the past twelve months. This included officiating in the Victoria Bitter One Day International Series and KFC T20 International Series. Simon also umpired in the Sheffield Shield Final and West Indies versus Pakistan One Day International Series.

Our scorers were also kept busy throughout the season. Congratulations to Mick Harper, who officiated in the scorer's box in his first Test Match. Mick became the 105th Australian Test Match scorer during the Third Commonwealth Bank Test Match between Australia and South Africa, which was played at the Adelaide Oval.

I would like to acknowledge the work that Neil Poulton has done for umpiring in South Australia and thank him for his contribution to SACA.

I also offer my congratulations to everyone who excelled, achieved their goals and contributed to the success of both umpiring and cricket in the past season, and look forward to continuing to work with you again in the coming season.

Mrs Bielby has offered her late husband's collection of Crockett Shield programs to SACUSA to peruse, so we are sure to be able to continue to increase our knowledge of the different eras. The truth is that our research is very much dependent on the willingness of individuals and families to share their memories and memorabilia, and SACUSA is extremely grateful to all those willing to help in this regard. Contact from anyone with knowledge of SACUSA history is certainly always welcome.

Much writing and designing must now be completed for our Association's history to be published. This is my focus for the next season. However, I am always interested to talk with anyone who believes they might have something of SACUSA's history of interest to us. Chances are, they will be correct and we will be very keen to communicate. With it being necessary for the SACUSA Hall of Fame to again be examined to see if new nominations are warranted, views from membership about people they believe might be suitable for nomination are welcome to be submitted to the History Sub-Committee. 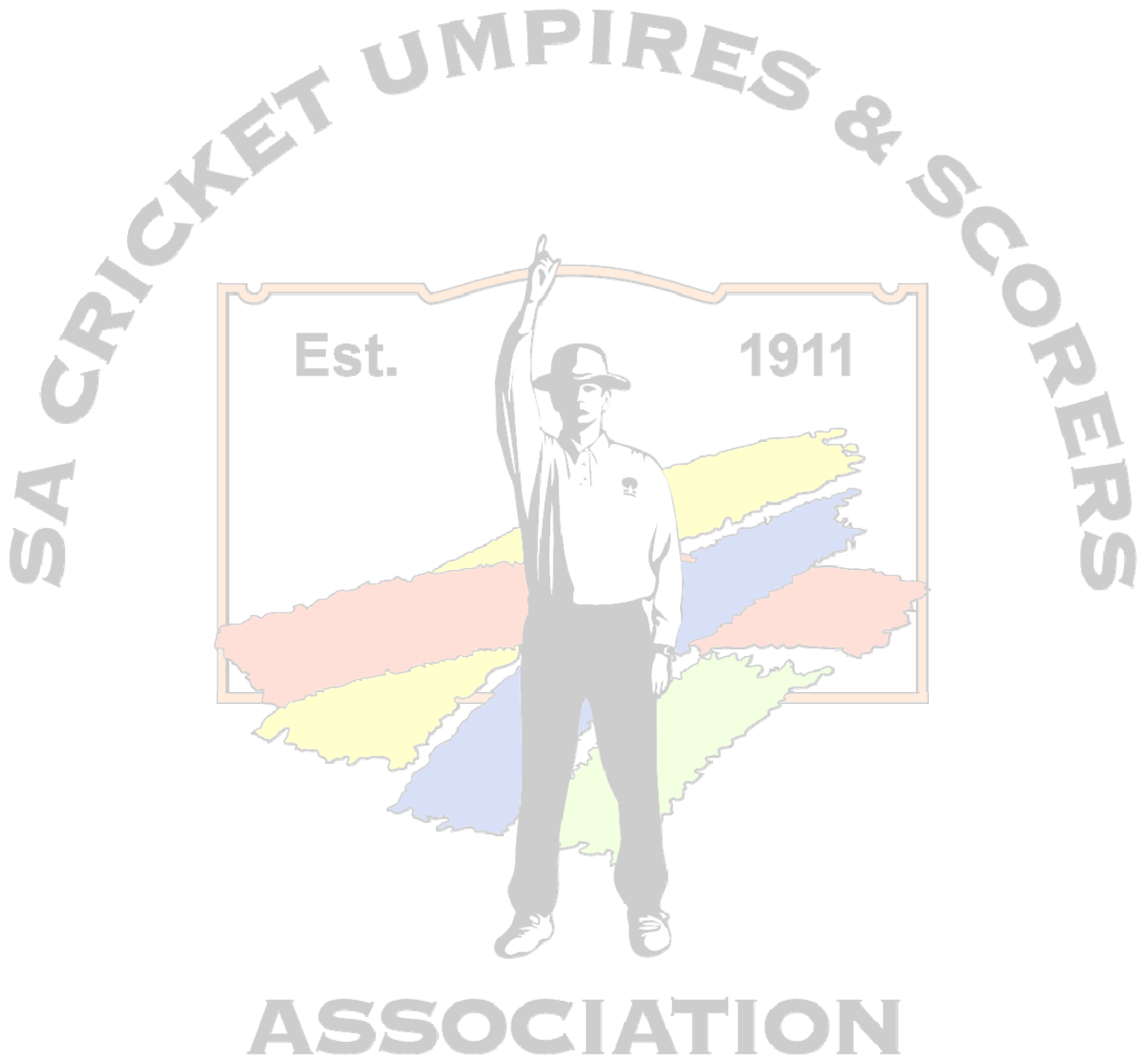

S.A.C.U.S.A. HALL OF FAME

Selection Criteria and Guidelines for Induction to the SACUSA Hall of Fame

- Rule 1. Candidacy is open to all umpires and scorers meeting the selection criteria who behaved in a manner which was conducive with the spirit and objectives of SACUSA.
- Rule 2. The SACUSA Executive Committee must appoint a Selection Panel of three impartial and independent individuals who decide on the successful inductees.
- Rule 3. The SACUSA Executive Committee is charged with the task of presenting a shortlist of possible inductees to the Selection Panel.
- Rule 4. Candidates must have made a very significant contribution to SACUSA, umpiring, scoring or their administration in South Australia over an extended period of time. A candidate's worthiness is purely at the discretion of the Selection Sub-committee in order to be considered for nomination.
- Rule 5. Candidates must have demonstrated an exceptional dedication to SACUSA, umpiring, scoring or their administration in South Australia and must not have illustrated behavior that would suggest a conflict with the ideals held by SACUSA during the era that the candidate actively contributed.
- Rule 6. Candidates must not have been actively umpiring or scoring within the cricketing environment for at least two years prior to nomination.
- Rule 7. The Hall of Fame must be reviewed at least every two years.

The Joyce McMenamin Trophy

In 2015 the Executive Committee, after being approached by Judy Little (a very supportive partner of former SACUSA President and longstanding SACUSA supporter, David Little) decided to create an award to officially recognise significant unofficial contributions by members' partners. The reason was to acknowledge the fact that SACUSA's support of South Australian cricket officials is significantly enhanced by 'behind-the-scenes' contributions from people who may have never actually officiated in cricket themselves. With the research completed by the History Sub-Committee, it was decided to name the trophy after Joyce McMenamin, the wife of long serving committee member, John McMenamin.

The criteria and nomination process for the Joyce McMenamin Trophy are as follows:

Criteria

- Reflect significant contributions to SACUA/SACUSA sustainability during any era of the organisation's existence

Process

- The Executive Committee to appoint a sub-committee to consider and nominate candidates
- Nominations are to be received from the general membership or from the sub-committee with the winner determined by the full Executive Committee.

The inaugural winner, Bev McLeod, was unable to attend the 2015/16 SACUSA Presentation Dinner to accept her award, so she was presented with it at this year's event instead. Bev was married to the late Graham McLeod, a very hard-working Secretary of the SACUA Executive for ten years. Bev accepted responsibility for hosting regular SACUA social events during Graham's years serving on the Executive Committee, and typed out the hundreds of pages of member statistical records that are contained in a very valuable little book held in SACUSA's historical records. The digital records now kept by SACUSA are possible because they were built upon the records that Bev maintained.

This year the 'Joyce McMenamin Trophy' was won by Pat Wilson – a lady who embraced the challenge of supporting her husband, Graham, to serve SACUA/SACUSA, knowing that it meant he had to sacrifice large amounts of time to the organisation. Graham served as Secretary for eight years, and since his passing Pat has continued to welcome and include new members and partners as SACUSA grows its operations.

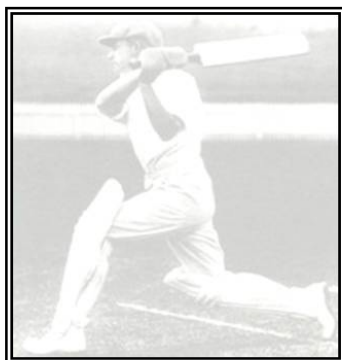

THE BRADMAN MEDAL



During season 1957/58 three SACUA Umpires, John McMenamin, Jack Kierse and Gordon Seymour, were enjoying a quiet drink after a SACUA meeting at the Hotel Adelaide in Pirie Street, when the 'idea' of an award for the best A Grade District Cricketer was proposed.

The original award, first made after season 1958/59, was based on one vote per game for the best player during an 'A' Grade match.

The first presentation dinner was held at the Seven Stars Hotel in Angas Street, Adelaide and was attended by approximately 30 umpires. Votes were counted during the dinner and, at the conclusion of the count, joint winners Ian McLachlan and Brian Quigley were announced. Neither of the winners were in attendance and taxis were sent to their homes to bring them to the dinner to receive their award.

During season 1976/77 it was decided that the District Cricketer Award should be renamed as the Bradman Medal and Sir Donald Bradman was approached for his approval. "The Don" agreed and said that he would be honoured to have the award named after him. The presentation of this prestigious award has continued and the Bradman Medal Presentation Dinner is now recognised as the pinnacle of any cricket season in South Australia.

Season 2007/08 celebrated 50 years since the inception of the District Cricketer Award/Bradman Medal. To celebrate this occasion winners (or family members) of the District Cricketer Award from 1956/57 to 1975/76 were presented with a Bradman Medal at the Bradman Medal Presentation Dinner on 19th March 2008. Also on the night three players who lost on a count-back were awarded Bradman Medals.
