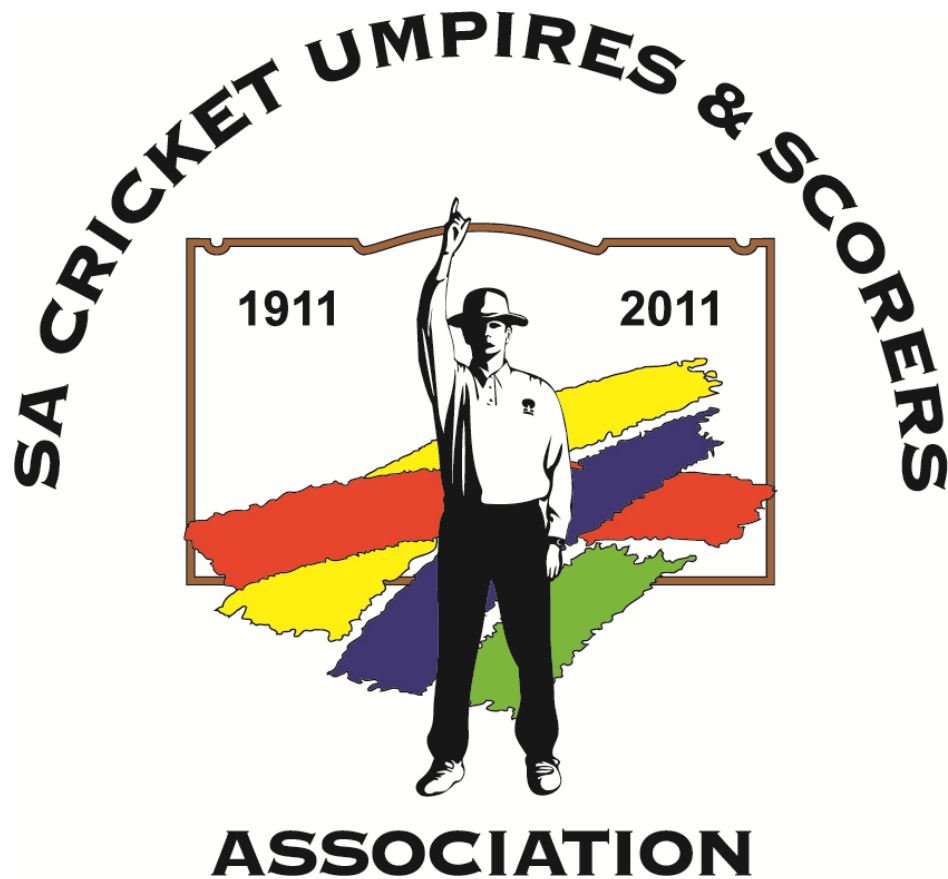

I would also like to take this opportunity to wish Cory all the best as he returns to his homeland of New Zealand (Wellington to be precise) to further his scientific and umpiring careers. And while still on the topic of congratulations, well done to Michael Williamson for travelling to the NT in February to officiate in the Male Under 15 National Championships. Last, but by no means least, a massive well done to Jimmy Edwards for taking out the 'Premier Cricket Umpire of the Year' award at this seasons' Bradman Medal Presentation.

For the second year in a row SACUSA's night of nights, the annual Presentation Dinner, was held at the Adelaide Pavilion. Once again the food and service were wonderful. TREASURER'S REPORT

(Lynton Donisthorpe)



Mr President and Members of SACUSA,

It is with great pleasure that I present to you the Treasurer's report of our Association's business for the 2015–2016 financial year.

Balance Sheet Summary

This year has been a very lucrative year for the Association financially. I projected at the last AGM a relatively typical financial year for a non-Easter year with no major events (outside of our regular schedule) to place strain on our finances. While an uneventful year is what we had, our finances ended significantly stronger than predicted. With receipts of \$43,348.07 and payments of \$34,814.24, we delivered an end of financial year balance in our working account of \$18,864.76 and a net surplus of \$8,533.83, which was considerably above expectations.

Membership

Membership numbers were up: 106 Full Members in 2015/16 (up from 96 in 2014/15), which is a more typical number for recent years, and we had 11 Associate Members (down from 17 in 2014/15). Life Members are not included in these figures. Scorers and umpires active, but not with SACA, remained relatively stable at 3 and 4 respectively.

Sponsorship

Sponsorship income was similar to 2014/15 with SACA continuing as a major sponsor. St John's Road continued as products sponsors for which we are very grateful. I once again want to thank sincerely our loyal sponsors and friends from Coverdrive Couriers for their ongoing contribution over many years.

Budget

Comparison

The Association finished the year with a surplus of \$8,533.83, which was well above our budgeted surplus of \$3,205. The primary reasons for this were that losses we had anticipated on events came in lower than expected. The most significant of these were: Membership income above budget (\$1,400 above budget) due largely to umpire pay memberships from last season being received this financial year; Presentation Dinner loss lower than expected (\$686 below budget) due to a lower than expected costs; Bradman Medal event loss (\$950 below budget) due primarily to lower costs for SACUSA guests; Presidents vs Vice Presidents event loss (\$596 below budget); expected History and Easter deposits not being required (\$1,000 below budget); anticipated property purchases not being expended (\$695 below budget); lottery showed an income below budget (\$880 below budget) due to timing of payments and income; and we purchased a new computer for our Secretary (\$1225 unbudgeted).

Trust

Accounts

The Glad Jones and George McDonagh trust funds (held in Westpac Community Solutions Cash Reserve Account) saw interest as the only income again this year. As a non-Easter year, there was no withdrawal for Easter Trophies (the reason the money was bequeathed to SACUSA). Interest income for the year in the account was \$14.79, leaving us with a final account balance of \$1,437.00, split between the two funds.

Current Position Overview

SACUSA have significantly strengthened our financial position this year. The Association is now very well placed to support members and fund future Association initiatives to support our members for the coming years and into the future.

**INDEPENDENT AUDIT REPORT TO THE MEMBERS OF THE
SOUTH AUSTRALIAN CRICKET UMPIRES AND SCORERS ASSOCIATION INC (SACUSA).**

Scope

We have audited the financial report, being a special purpose financial report of the South Australian Cricket Umpires and Scorers Association Inc. (SACUSA) for the year ended 30 June 2016 comprising the Statement of Receipts and Payments and the Statement of Cash Balances.

Officers' responsibility for the financial report

The committee is responsible for the financial report and has determined that the accounting policies used and described in Notes 1 and 2 to the financial statements which form part of the financial report are appropriate to meet the requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act SA 1985 and are appropriate to meet the needs of the members.

Auditor's responsibility

Our responsibility is to express an opinion on the financial report based on our audit. We have conducted our audit of the financial report in order to express an opinion on it to the members. No opinion is expressed as to whether the accounting policies used, and described in Notes 1 and 2, are appropriate to the needs of the members.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial report. The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgement, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the financial report, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal control relevant to the entity's preparation and fair presentation of the financial report in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the entity's internal control. An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates made by the Board as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the financial report.

We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our audit opinion.

Audit Opinion

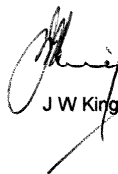

Glad Jones and George McDonagh Memorial Trust Funds

As a part of the biennial cricket match against the Victorian Cricket Association Umpires and Scorers Association, trophies are awarded to the best performed South Australian players for overall performance and fielding. These awards are made as a result of trust funds held by the South Australian Cricket Umpires and Scorers Association from monies donated by former members Gladstone Jones and George McDonagh.

The first fund, the Glad Jones Memorial Trust Fund, was established in March 1976 with a donation of \$150.00 from Mr. Gladstone Jones for a trophy to be awarded to the best performed player representing South Australia. Two years later Mr. George McDonagh made a similar donation, establishing the George McDonagh Memorial Trust Fund to enable an award to be made to the best performed fielder during these matches.

The donations remain invested at the discretion of the SACUSA Committee, however, in the event that a decision was taken to discontinue the matches in the future, the funds and any interest earned was to be donated to the National Heart Foundation. After the establishment of both funds the Executive Committee of the South Australian Cricket Umpires Association was empowered to use the interest earned from both funds to award the trophies after each match. An increase to the capital invested of \$200.00 was made to each fund during the late 1980's from interest already earned to ensure that a sound basis for interest earning existed and therefore the continuation of the awards.

SA UMPIRING MANAGER (Neil Poulton)



Mr President and Members of SACUSA,

It is my pleasure to present my report on umpiring for season 2015/16. This year SACA made considerable progress in its goal to consolidate and manage umpire resources throughout metropolitan cricket. Already managing and coordinating umpires for the Adelaide Turf Cricket Association (ATCA), SACA also acquired this responsibility for the Para Districts Cricket Association (PDCA) and Adelaide and Suburban Cricket Association (ASCA).

The pre-season commenced with our annual umpiring launch which was held at the Adelaide Convention Centre. The evening was well attended by SACUSA members and umpires from all associations. In the following weeks law study nights were held at Adelaide Oval with umpires working through questions and scenarios within their panels, led by their umpire coach. Pre-season concluded with a full day seminar at Adelaide Oval for all umpires on Saturday 19 September, while Sunday 20 September was attended by Panel 1 umpires only. The seminar included presentations from Steve Davis, Daryl Harper, and Cricket Australia's Match Officials Manager, Sean Easey, along with sessions on fitness, nutrition and psychology.

This season SACA made 5,100 individual umpire appointments to over 90 grades of competition, utilising 274 umpires in the metropolitan area. SACUSA members featured predominately in these appointments with umpires involved in many levels of club cricket throughout the state. Along with the above, aggressive targets were met to recruit and train new umpires, building the base for metropolitan cricket. SACA achieved its strategic goal of 176 new accredited umpires throughout South Australia, 65 of which were new umpires to senior metropolitan cricket. There were 13 new representative umpires and over 600 participants attended 28 umpire training sessions.

The performance of all umpires across Premier Cricket was continually measured throughout the season from team captains and SACA's umpire coaches. The result was pleasing with a satisfaction rating which exceeded any previous years. Premier League continued to be an important start to the season for our umpires. Sixteen SACA and CA umpires benefited from the experience of umpiring in the Premier League, including umpire exchanges from Darwin and PNG.

SACA umpires had representation at National Tournaments such as the Under 17 National Championships, Australian Country Championships, National Indigenous Championships, and 15 and Under School Boys competition.

Our State Panel in Luke Uthenwoldt, Craig Thomas, Cain Kemp and Cory Black did an outstanding job in the WNCL, WBBL and Futures League competitions, the highlight being Luke Uthenwoldt standing in his first televised match, at Adelaide Oval in the WBBL. Simon Fry continued to lead the national umpire panel whilst also representing his country and the ICC at international level including the T20 World Cup. In addition, Simon also achieved the greatest accolade when he umpired his first Test Match, Sri Lanka v West Indies at Colombo.

Congratulations to all umpires who achieved milestones during the season and thank you for your continued support. SACA will continue its progression to grow umpiring across the state, nurture umpires through the pathway and support those with higher aspirations.

HISTORY COMMITTEE REPORT

Mr President and Members of SACUSA,

Another season has passed into history, and been recorded in a most modern and technologically appropriate way via Facebook. We have albums aplenty stored on social media platforms, and are now reaching thousands of people when we display our SACUSA history as it happens. This is great news for successfully promoting the wonderful work that cricket officials do, but the format doesn't appeal to everyone. This is why the History Sub-committee is excited to be well on the way to publishing a book.

1979 Life Member, Keith Jew, published a small booklet in the 1980s detailing the knowledge that SACUA then had about its past. We have come such a long way since then in terms of expanding what we know about the Association, and about the people who have made sure it continues to operate. What is really wonderful about this is that we are finding that our colleagues from seasons past are amazing people who did so much more than excellently umpire or score cricket. They are people who lived inspiring lives and made huge contributions to South Australian sport, but who, in many cases, have been forgotten after their passing. The support of the SACUSA membership in helping the History Sub-committee pursue its research is an investment in strengthening cricket officiating and South Australian historical records, and is very much appreciated by me and my fellow sub-committee members, Max Bartlett and Ed Branson.

A new initiative has been realised this season, and established due to the increase in historical knowledge we now have about different aspects of the Association. In addition to our research helping to create the 'Buckett Hammond Award for Scorer of the Year' three seasons ago, the Executive Committee signed off on the new 'Joyce McMenamin Trophy' last season after Judy Little, the wife of former President, David Little, approached the committee with the idea of officially recognising significant unofficial contributions by partners of SACUSA's best workers. Much of SACUSA's operations couldn't occur without the 'behind-the-scenes' assistance of members' partners, whether it be in the area of keeping the family unit running while a committee member channelled their time and efforts into the Association, or even directly helping out with SACUSA operations such as hosting official social functions or typing up records. We couldn't have named the award without having been able to research who an appropriate namesake for the award might be, and the result of our efforts uncovered the lovely lady, Joyce McMenamin, who was an incredibly dedicated supporter of mid-20th century committee member, John. Her spirit of helping John in everything he did for SACUSA - from looking after their three daughters while John umpired and served on committee (all while Joyce also worked outside the home), to also assisting with Crockett Shield preparations and other of John's SACUSA responsibilities over many years - captures the intention of the award in recognising those people who juggle a variety of roles so SACUSA can benefit. It was very rewarding to see our research impact so positively on SACUSA, and with the knowledge gained I was thrilled to see the Executive Committee support the nomination made from the membership of our beautiful friend, Bev McLeod, as inaugural winner of the 'Joyce McMenamin Trophy' this season. As Bev was unable to attend the Presentation Dinner - a very unusual occurrence for her - the official presentation will be made to her at the 2016/17 presentation event. I hope you can join me next year in seeing Bev acknowledged for her truly mighty efforts made to SACUSA over decades.

Thankfully, donations continue to be made to SACUSA in the form of historic material and records, so our collection of items grows considerably. We will certainly have plenty of items to display if SACUSA is fortunate enough to find a permanent home, but in the meantime we are storing and

recording these items in digital format in order to preserve them for future generations. It was hoped our 'virtual museum' would be operating by now, but the book is currently taking precedence over that – however, it will materialise (in a digital sense) and I continue to encourage anyone who has memorabilia or items relevant to SACUSA to contact us so we can borrow them for preservation and learn more about our past.

One surprise which happened earlier this year was the purchase of a 1936 SACUA name tag manufactured for the cricket match we play against our Victorian colleagues (prior to it being named the Crockett Shield). We were contacted by a new member, Mike Lake, who had spotted the item on Ebay and thought we may be interested. This is an important addition to our collection, and I'd urge you all to let us know if you see anything like that, from our history, so we can expand our knowledge of who, and what, came before us.

Please feel free to contact me should you wish to share any memories you have of your time with SACUSA, or if you have a query about an historical aspect you'd like to find out about. Pencil in mid-2017 for the book launch, consider buying a copy for your own slice of new revelations of SA sporting fact, and make your own history this coming season with magnificent performances and lots of fun.

All the best for a wonderful season – I look forward to speaking with any members who'd like to chat about SACUSA past, present and future.

S.A.C.U.S.A. HALL OF FAME

Selection Criteria and Guidelines for Induction to the SACUSA Hall of Fame

- Rule 1. Candidacy is open to all umpires and scorers meeting the selection criteria who behaved in a manner which was conducive with the spirit and objectives of SACUSA.
- Rule 2. The SACUSA Executive Committee must appoint a Selection Panel of three impartial and independent individuals who decide on the successful inductees.
- Rule 3. The SACUSA Executive Committee is charged with the task of presenting a shortlist of possible inductees to the Selection Panel.
- Rule 4. Candidates must have made a very significant contribution to SACUSA, umpiring, scoring or their administration in South Australia over an extended period of time. A candidate's worthiness is purely at the discretion of the Selection Sub-committee in order to be considered for nomination.
- Rule 5. Candidates must have demonstrated an exceptional dedication to SACUSA, umpiring, scoring or their administration in South Australia and must not have illustrated behavior that would suggest a conflict with the ideals held by SACUSA during the era that the candidate actively contributed.
- Rule 6. Candidates must not have been actively umpiring or scoring within the cricketing environment for at least two years prior to nomination.
- Rule 7. The Hall of Fame must be reviewed at least every two years.

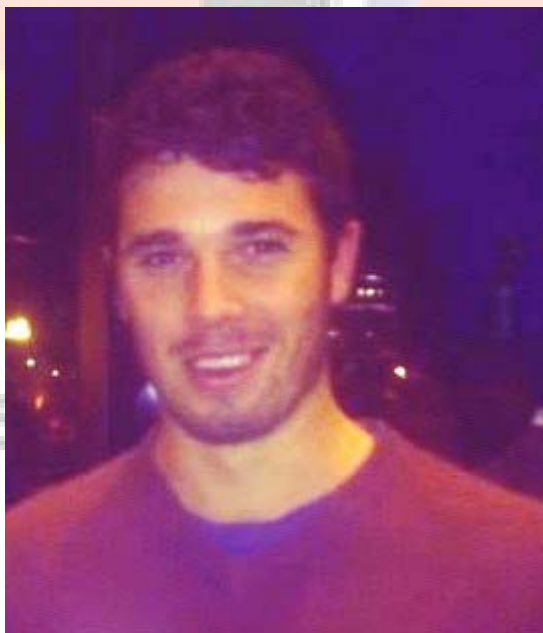

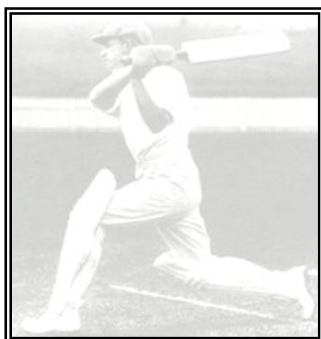

During season 1957/58 three SACUA Umpires, John McMenamin, Jack Kierse and Gordon Seymour, were enjoying a quiet drink after a SACUA meeting at the Hotel Adelaide in Pirie Street, when the 'idea' of an award for the best A Grade District Cricketer was proposed.

The original award, first made at the conclusion of season 1958/59, was based on one vote per game for the best player during an 'A' Grade match.

The first presentation dinner was held at the Seven Stars Hotel in Angas Street, Adelaide and was attended by approximately 30 umpires. Votes were counted during the dinner and, at the conclusion of the count, joint winners Ian McLachlan and Brian Quigley were announced. Neither of the winners were in attendance and taxis were sent to their homes to bring them to the dinner to receive their award.

During season 1976/77 it was decided that the District Cricketer Award should be renamed as the Bradman Medal and Sir Donald Bradman was approached for his approval. "The Don" agreed and said that he would be honoured to have the award named after him. The presentation of this prestigious award has continued and the Bradman Medal Presentation Dinner is now recognised as the pinnacle of any cricket season in South Australia.

Season 2007/08 celebrated 50 years since the inception of the District Cricketer Award/Bradman Medal. To celebrate this occasion winners (or family members) of the District Cricketer Award from 1958/59 to 1975/76 were presented with a Bradman Medal at the Bradman Medal Presentation Dinner on 19th March 2008. Also on the night three players who lost on a count-back were awarded Bradman Medals.
